

TOWN OF REDVERS

BYLAW NO. 330/95

THE COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF REDVERS IN COUNCIL ASSEMBLED
ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. NOISE BYLAW

This bylaw may be cited as the "Redvers Noise Control Bylaw".

2. DEFINITIONS

- (1) "Council" means the Council of Redvers.
- (2) "Motor vehicle" means a vehicle propelled or driven by any means other than by muscular power.
- (3) "Noise" includes any loud outcry, clamour, shouting or movements, or any sound that is loud or harsh or undesirable, including the sound of exploding fireworks, firecrackers less than 3 inches in length and paper percussion caps.
- (4) "Person" includes any company, corporation, owner.
- (5) "Property" means real property and includes land, other than a highway, together with all improvements which have been so affixed to the land as to make them in fact and in law a part thereof.
- (6) "Signaling device" means a horn, gong, bell, klaxon, siren or other device producing an audible sound for the purpose of drawing people's attention to an approaching vehicle, including a bicycle.
- (7) "Town" means the Town of Redvers.

3. GENERAL REGULATIONS

- (1) No person being the tenant or occupier of property in the Town shall allow or permit such real property to be used so that noise or sound which occurs thereon or emanates therefrom disturbs or tends to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort, or convenience of any person or persons on the same piece of property or in the neighborhood or vicinity.
- (2) No person shall play or operate any radio, stereophonic equipment, outdoor public address system apparatus for the production or amplification of sound either in or on private premises or in any public place in such a manner as to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of a neighborhood in the Town or of persons in the vicinity.
- (3) No hawker, huckster, peddler, newsvendor, or other person shall by his intermittent or reiterated cries disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of individuals or the public.

- (4) No person shall operate a snow vehicle, motorboat or motorcycle which makes or causes noise in such a manner as to disturb the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of a neighborhood of the Town or of persons in the vicinity.
- (5) No persons in the Town shall on any day before 6:00 a.m. or after 10:00 p.m. construct, erect, reconstruct, alter, repair or demolish any building, structure or thing or excavate or fill in land in any manner which disturbs the quiet, peace, rest, enjoyment, comfort or convenience of the neighborhood or of persons in the vicinity.

4. EXCEPTIONS

The provisions of this Bylaw shall not apply to:

- (1) the ringing of bells or playing of music by churches, religious establishments and schools.
- (2) the moderate use of musical instruments to call attention to an opportunity to contribute to a collection made for a charitable undertaking at any time.
- (3) the playing of a band, the sounding of a steam whistle, use of a signalling device, the sounding of motor vehicles' horns or the use of sound amplification equipment used in connection with any parade.
- (4) the sounding of a factory whistle and similar devices at normal appropriate times.
- (5) the sounding of police whistles, signalling devices, or the sirens on any vehicle used by the police or fire department or on any ambulance or public service vehicle.
- (6) any use of sound amplification equipment used by the police, fire department or any ambulance service or public service.
- (7) the use in a reasonable manner of any apparatus or mechanism for the amplification of the human voice or of music in a public park or any other commodious space in connection with any public election meeting, public celebration, or other reasonable gathering.
- (8) the sounding of motor vehicle horns when used within reason.
- (9) notwithstanding any provisions of this bylaw, a person may perform works of an emergency nature for the preservation or protection of life, health or property.
- (10) notwithstanding any provision of this bylaw a person may detonate fireworks subject to provisions of Bylaw No. 327/95.

5. PENALTY SECTION

- (1) Every person who violates any of the provisions of this bylaw or who suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention or in violation of any of the provisions of this bylaw, who neglects to do or refrains from doing anything required to be done by any of the provisions of this bylaw or who does any act which violates any of the provisions of this bylaw, is guilty of an offence against this bylaw and liable to penalties hereby imposed.
- (2) What is a noise to disturb the comfort or repose of any person or persons so as to justify a prosecution under this Bylaw is a question of fact for the Court that hears a prosecution of an offence against this Bylaw.

- (3) By way of corroboration of other evidence, the court which hears prosecution of an offence against this Bylaw may infer from the evidence of a peace officer relating to the conduct of any person or persons that the comfort and repose of persons within the limits of the Municipality was disturbed.
- (4) Any person who contravenes any provision of this Bylaw is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not less than \$50.00 nor greater than \$200.00.

6. Bylaw No. 292/92 is hereby repealed.

Bylaw No. 554/2012

A BYLAW OF THE TOWN OF REDVERS TO AMEND BYLAW 330/95 KNOWN AS
THE NOISE BYLAW.

1. Amend Bylaw 330/95 by adding the following at the end of "General Regulations"
(6) THAT Engine Retarder brakes will be prohibited.
