NEIGHBORS AND FRIENDS

Back a few years ago, when the city of Calgary was expanding so fast the coyotes could barely keep out of the way of new subdivisions popping up like mushrooms over night, I remember reading a story about an exchange between a radio talk show host and a woman who had recently moved to Cow town.

The talk show's theme was more or less "How do you like us so far?" and most of the callers had good things to say, but this one woman had a different story. When she and her husband had moved their family there from Toronto she had been anticipating the good, old fashioned friendliness that the Prairie Provinces are known for. And yet, after almost a whole year they were beginning to feel that the promise of western hospitality had been false advertising. They had met none of their neighbours, everyone seemed to keep to themselves. She felt cheated.

The talk show host responded by challenging her to go knock on a few doors, strike up a conversation on the sidewalk, or ask the name of a plant in someone's yard ... you know, make the first move, and see what happened. A few days later she called back. She had done as he had asked and everyone she had talked to so far shared her experience; they had all moved to this big western city with its friendly reputation from Toronto and had all been disappointed with the empty reception.

Now you can read that story in a number of ways. You can bash Torontonians. You can excuse Calgarians. You can say it was their own fault for waiting for someone else to make the first move, but if all you do is analyze the past you fail to act in the present or alter the future. The story, of course, had a happy ending – with the common experience of having made the same life move this woman and her new neighbours bonded, finding the friends and neighbours they had been looking for after all.

I don't know where that Calgary neighbourhood is but I'm quite familiar with another one. From the time my sister and her family moved into their home they have been a part of a network of non-blood family. Their neighbourhood families have weathered child rearing, cancer deaths, divorces, teenager troubles, parents' deaths, and heart attacks by simply being there for each other. They regularly have meals together, share beers on their driveways together, sometimes holiday together, watch each other's houses, and look out for each other's kids. That kind of human bond is worth its weight in gold. At one point one of the families were transferred to the Maritimes but when they were moved back to Calgary the top request on their real estate needs was the address – it had to be close to "home".

This new promotion of the Town of Redvers to hold a Block Party Week is a great idea. You might think that in a town of 1,000 people everyone probably already knows everyone else, but I beg to differ. In the five years since I retired as postmaster there have been so many new faces added to our community, and so many people move to different homes that it's easy to see how having a 'getting to know you' party would be a useful, as well as a fun, thing to do.

Go build those golden bonds of humanity, people! Don't wait for someone from Toronto to start that ball rolling.

REDVERS HOME TO NEIGHBOURHOOD BLOCK PARTY WEEK

Looking for a way to introduce yourself to the new neighbour down the street? Want to keep your community connected? Are your kids begging you to get together with all of the other kids on the block? Whether you want to swap recipes or socialize with the neighbours, block parties are time-honoured traditions in neighbourhoods all across the country.

Redvers Economic Development is excited to announce Neighbourhood Block Party Week right here in our community! Throughout the week of August 19 – 25th, neighbourhoods throughout Redvers will gather to enjoy each other's company, socialize and have fun!

TOP 10 REASONS TO HAVE A BLOCK PARTY

1. To have fun – no excuses or reasons are needed to celebrate!
2. To meet your neighbours and welcome new ones.
3. Knowing others in your neighbourhood and where they live improves community spirit and safety.
4. To establish friendships.
5. To increase the sense of belonging in your community.
6. To plan other neighbourhood projects, that inspire community connection.
7. To encourage neighbours to look after the neighbourhood and each other.
8. To help with safety/crime prevention by knowing who lives where and who does not.
9. To learn a little about each other and know who might need a little extra help from time to time.
10. To start a neighbourhood tradition.

Wondering how to get started? It's as easy as 1-2-3! We have developed a Neighbourhood Block Party Guide to make planning your get-together a breeze!

Here are a few things to consider when planning your Block Party:

- The idea of a neighbourhood block party is to bring neighbours together. It's a good idea to find 1 or 2 neighbours willing to help you with the event.
- Pick a day during the week of August 19 – 25th that works best for the majority of residents in your neighbourhood.
- Start small! It is much easier to grow an event than it is to shrink it.
- In selecting who to invite, use natural neighbourhood boundaries where possible (*e.g.*, end of the block). If you are planning a street or cul-de-sac party, you should invite everyone from that area.
- What type of block party is best for your neighbourhood? A barbeque? Picnic? Potluck? Catered? No food?
- What location is best for your party? An alley? Street? Park? Backyard? House? Common Room in a Condo Unit?
- If you wish to hold your Block Party on a street, road or in a park (public property), a no-fee permit is required to be submitted to the Town of Redvers two weeks prior to the event. This is to ensure that the public can be informed of any street closures.
- As long as you do not plan on charging for food and it is only open to residences of the neighbourhood or block (not a public event), you will not require a food permit. The Public Health office will consider the event a private function or potluck.
- If you plan on allowing alcohol at your Block Party, contact Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming to determine if a permit is required.
- Emergency access is required at all times during the event (*e.g.*, fire, ambulance or police vehicle/personnel).
- Try not to go overboard! It can make people feel the event is too much work. Keep it simple!
- And most importantly, have fun!!

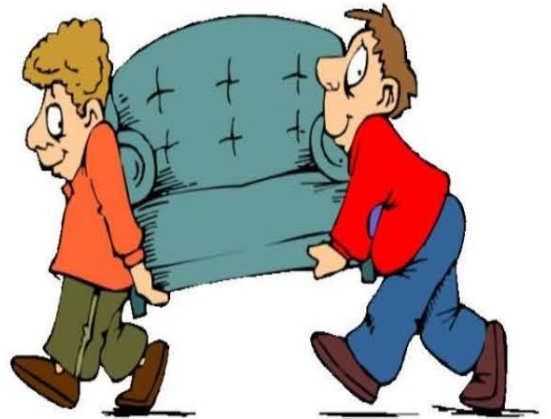

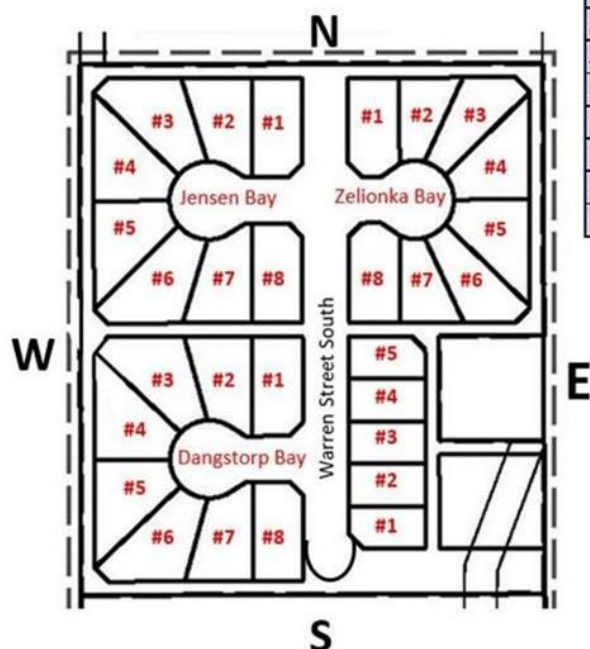

AQUATIC HABITAT PROTECTION PERMITS..... DO YOU NEED ONE?

Update from the Lower Souris Watershed Committee

The Aquatic Habitat Protection Program protects aquatic habitat from potential impacts from development projects or activities conducted in or around water in Saskatchewan. Development projects that are poorly designed, constructed or timed can be harmful to aquatic habitat due to erosion, sedimentation, loss of aquatic and riparian vegetation and substrate alteration. Water quality can also be affected through the addition of chemicals, oil, gasoline, herbicides, and more.

Do you need an Aquatic Habitat Protection Permit (AHPP)?

Any work that occurs in the bed (area covered by water), bank (rising ground bordering the water body) or boundary (end of the riparian zone) of a water body or water course is subject to *The Environmental Management and Protection Act, 2010* and requires an **AHPP PRIOR TO BEGINNING WORK**. Work done on water bodies or watercourses wholly contained on private land, owned by one individual that DOES NOT flow into other surface waters are exempt.

Some types of work that require an AHPP include, but are not limited to:

- Removal of aquatic or riparian vegetation
- Channel clearing, channelization, wetland infilling/drainage, maintenance of existing drainage ditches, and construction of new drainage ditches
- Dugout development in or near a creek or water run that leaves your property
- Recreational developments such as boat launches, permanent docks, lake access trails, and boathouses
- Water use infrastructure such as pumphouses, water intakes, and waterline development

The aquatic vegetation and submerged rock found along shorelines not only provides cover and shelter for fish, insects and other invertebrates, but also maintains stability and reduces erosion. Trees, shrubs and grasses and their root structure found along a bank also helps to protect the shoreline. Using appropriate building materials, project designs and timing, impacts associated with development can be minimized resulting in the protection of aquatic habitat.

To apply for an Aquatic Habitat Protection Permit, be sure to apply well in advance. It may take up to 3 months for approval. Application forms and more information are available on the Water Security Agency's website, wsask.ca.

With current cost-share funding programs available for agricultural water source development or protection (for example, dugouts, intake lines, runoff control projects, and more), all permits must be in order **prior to the work being done**. Without these permits, the funding may be denied. Plan ahead and be prepared.

Lower Souris Watershed Committee staff are available to assist you in determining if an AHPP is required and if so, can assist with the development and submission of the application forms. Contact Karmen at 306-452-7953 for more information.

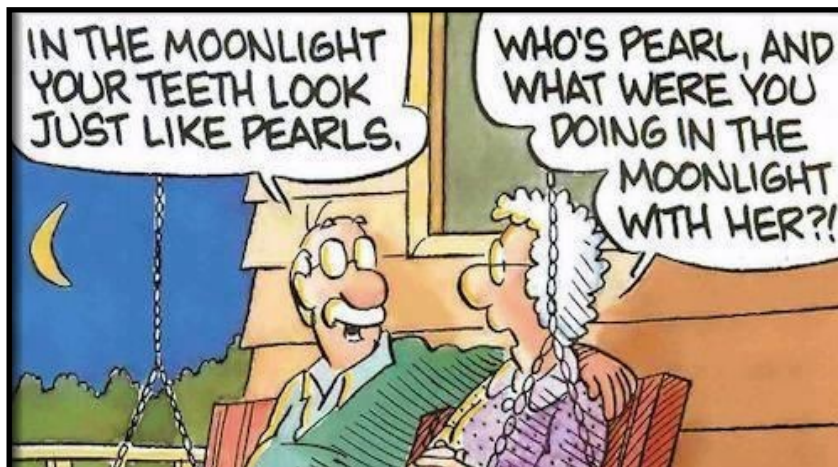

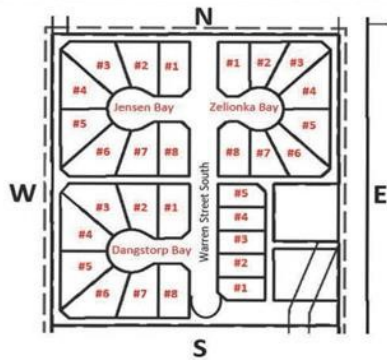

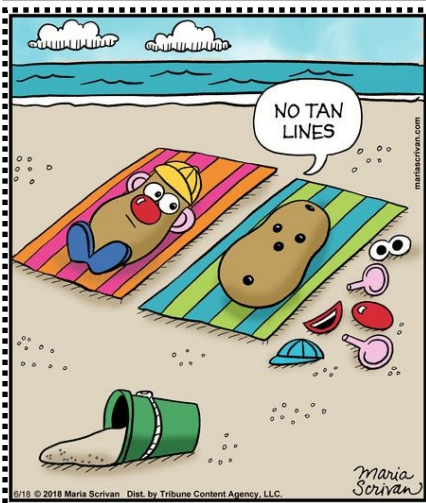

The Redvers Swimming Pool Project starts September 1st. This project is both for maintenance as well as a much needed overhaul of our toddler pool. The Redvers Swimming Pool has been up and running for more years than I can remember. The last upgrade to the facility was in 1994, 24 years ago! Time sure flies.

The plans are to eliminate the current toddler pool installing a zero beach entry in its place making it easily accessible for all users, along with spray features and a toddler zone. With the zero beach entry this will attach to the main pool where we will be replacing the current liner. This is no small undertaking for the facility and all of our patrons but a much needed one in the same breath. Take a look, exciting isn't it!!

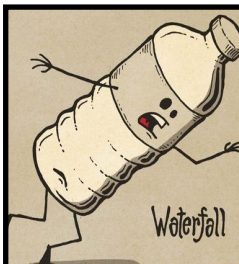
