LOWER SOURIS WATERSHED COMMITTEE UPDATE

There are hundreds of abandoned water wells throughout our watershed. Abandoned water wells can pose a risk to our water supply and can be a safety hazard to people and animals. The Lower Souris Watershed Committee has assisted many landowners, including farmers and ranchers, rural & urban municipalities, and acreage owners to properly decommission these unused water wells. There are specific decommissioning methods for large and small diameter wells as recommended by the Water Security Agency. Contact Karmen today at 306.452.7953 or karmen@lowsouris.com to discuss how to properly decommission a water well, to find out about potential funding to do so, and to learn about how to organize a mass well decommissioning project in your area.



WATER WELL DECOMMISSIONING

There are many risks involved with abandoned water wells such as:

1. Contamination of our groundwater supply
2. Safety hazard for people, animals and equipment, especially for large diameter wells
3. Liability risk – landowners with abandoned wells on their property are responsible for proper decommissioning of those wells
4. Reduced property values



Contact your local Agri-Environmental Services Technician for information on how to apply for **90%** cost-share funding (to a maximum of \$10,000 per project) decommissioning abandoned water wells to mitigate these risks.

JUNIOR FIREFIGHTER CHALLENGE HELD DURING CANADA DAY

A couple months ago at one of our fire meetings, we discussed the idea of putting together a children's event that would be a little different than what most people would expect.

Over the past couple years, a group of us from the Redvers Volunteer Fire Department, have had a blast participating in the Alameda/Moose Creek Annual Firefighter Challenge at Alameda Sk. We had been working hard to train for these events and have been rewarded for our efforts, walking away with the trophy in back to back years. This Challenge tests us on many disciplines which we firefighters may be expected to utilize in all types of calls we receive. It has truly been a test for us but has simply pushed us to be better community members, more physically and mentally prepared for any call in any condition, and to work thoroughly on techniques that will benefit our safety when assisting someone in need.

With the sheer enjoyment and camaraderie that we've seen and received from our Firefighter challenge participation, we felt it would be a great fit for our community. And to top it off, the children of our community would have a chance to play the role of Firefighter for the day, and feel the intensity of wearing real gear in a safe environment.

The last couple weeks leading up to our July 1st festivities, we spent hours planning and setting up high intensity skill testing obstacles which we had received fairly positive feedback up to Saturday.

That "fairly positive" feedback was quickly upgraded to excitement and intensity as we seen an overwhelming response throughout the day Sunday. With Kids aged 3-14 participating in the event, our expectations were beyond exceeded. The categories were split ages 3-5, 6-8, 9-11, and 12-14, with 2 different courses set up. Kids 3-8 participated in a course with 9 obstacles while the 9-14year old's completed a course with 11 obstacles. Each contestant was awarded with their choice of a fire hat, fire ruler/pencil or a water hydrant water bottle.

By the end of the day, we had a total of 91 contestants pass through the doors. 55 kids aged 3-8 powered through the course, and 36 kids aged 9-14 challenge their skills. The event ran from 9am-12pm then again after the parade from 2-4 p.m. That's right, 91 kids through the courses in 5 hours. At 4:30, we invited the top 4 competitors from each age category back to the spotlight to push each other a little further. And things heated up with everyone's adrenaline rushing. Each of these kids had a great time and proved they were ready when they got the call!!

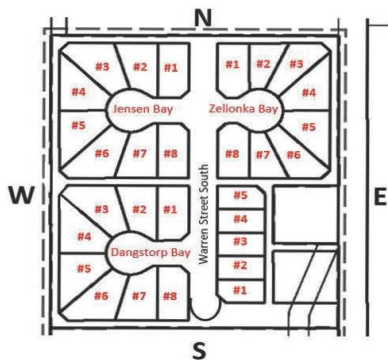

TOWN OF REDVERS WASTE DISPOSAL SITE

REGULATIONS AND HOURS OF OPERATION EFFECTIVE MAY 31, 2018

The Town of Redvers has moved the large red bins that were located behind the Town Office to our Lagoon site. This site will now be available as a Waste Disposal Site and will be open limited hours a week to the residents of Redvers. Please continue using your curbside garbage and recycling bins. This site is for large item and extra garbage disposal ONLY. Listed are the regulations and hours of operation.

This site will be under 24 hour surveillance. There is no cost to the residents of the Town of Redvers.

The large garbage item pick up courtesy will still be available on Thursday's, just call us at the office with your address and it will be added to the town men's work list.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding this, please call us at the Town Office at (306)452-3533.

Regulations:

*Persons must be a town resident to be able to dump at the Waste Disposal Site, any non-residents, illegal dumping including after hours or non-accepted items will be fined \$500.00

*Contractors are not allowed to use this site for dumping and renovation refuse is not accepted

*We DO NOT accept the following:

- Paper, newspaper, cardboard, tin cans or aluminum or other recyclable materials
- No hazardous wastes, such as used oil
- No manure, grain, petroleum wastes, contaminated soils, asbestos material, pesticide containers, slaughter house waste, dead animals or any other comparable wastes
- Persons must obtain authorization from council before disposing concrete

*There will be a pile for clean wood (trees) as well as a compost pile for leaves and grass ONLY

FULLY ACCESSIBLE PLAYGROUND COMING SOON

The Redvers and District Lions Club and Redvers School Community Council (SCC) joined forces in 2012 to work cooperatively on improving the existing Redvers School Playground. Together this group started the Redvers School Playground Fund, which focused efforts on three distinct project phases. Phase One focused on general maintenance and repair of the existing structures and was completed in the summer of 2012.

Phase Two was a larger project with the goal of installing several new structures to promote free play and exercise on a variety of equipment. After an extensive letter writing campaign which resulted in numerous individual and corporate donations, many school and community fundraising efforts and a generous Community Vitality Program grant, a small army of local volunteers pitched in to assemble and install new swing sets, basketball standards, and a large multi-function play structure.

Phase Three of our playground project is well underway. The old wood play structure on the west side of the Elementary School entrance was deemed unsafe and was removed over a year ago. This space has remained vacant but will soon see a fully accessible play area with interactive play structures that will meet the diverse needs of all children, including those with mobility issues. Our plan includes installing a pour-in-place rubber surface for access to the play equipment which is also wheelchair accessible. We want to create an inclusive area in which children of all abilities and needs can play together.

The Redvers School Playground is located in the heart of Redvers and provides a variety of play experiences for school aged children as well as preschool children and their families and is used year round. The Redvers Lions Club and School Community Council have dedicated years to this project and will complete this third and final phase of the School Playground improvement project in the summer of 2018.

We are working closely with One Stop Playgrounds of Humboldt, Saskatchewan as we design this play area. The equipment is on order our installation date will be July 10th and 11th, just around the corner! Not only will we be lining up local contractors to prepare the site and work with us during the installation, we will also be counting on many volunteers to assist with the installation process. Each day we are required to have 15-20 volunteers available to help with the digging, building and setting up of the play equipment. We need your help Redvers!

To date we have secured 80% of the funds required to complete this project. We are now turning to local stakeholders and businesses alike who may be able to assist us to get this project done! Our sponsors and donors are recognized publicly through our local media and through signage at the school. 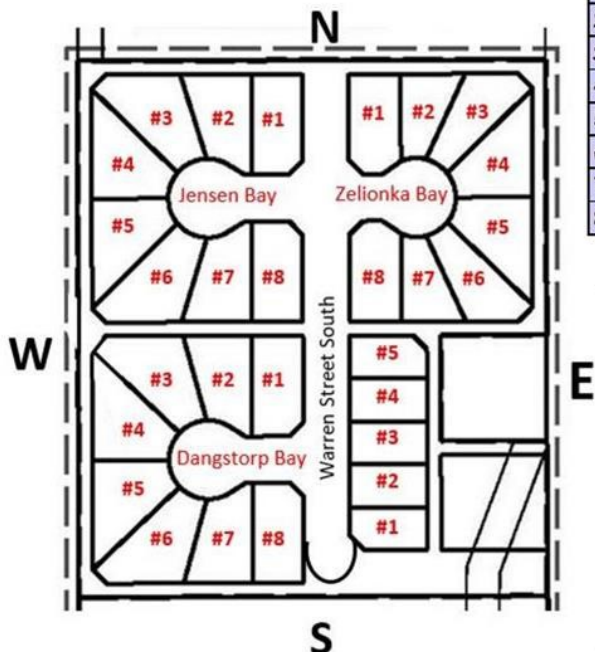

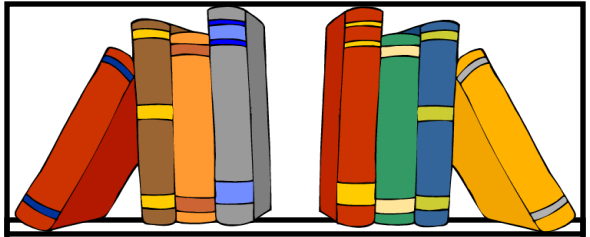
