Much of southeastern Saskatchewan has been covered in frost since the beginning of December. Meteorologists say that the gorgeous ice formations are the combination of rime ice and hoar frost. Rime ice forms on cold days or nights when atmospheric conditions are calm and an abundance of moisture is in place, as was the case with the multiple days of fog we experienced. Hoar frost forms in a similar way, but doesn't require as much moisture. Images of gorgeous ice crystals and formations have been abundant. 





2019 Business Licences

At the November 28, 2018 Town Council meeting, Business Licensing Bylaw 643-2018 was passed. A copy of the Bylaw will be mailed out to all Town of Redvers businesses.

The bylaw states that anyone operating a business within Town limits must hold a valid Business Licence.

- If the business is located within the Town of Redvers and the owner pays commercial taxes, a municipal business licence is not required.
- If the business is located within the Town of Redvers and the business owner does not pay commercial taxes (such as is the case with rental space), a municipal business licence is required.
- If the business is situated outside of Town limits but does business in Redvers, a municipal business licence is required.

To obtain a Business Licence, an Application Form must be filled out and the associated fee is to be paid in full. Applications for business licences are available at the Town Office.

The fee schedule for 2019 Business Licences is:


 $\begin{array}{ll} \mbox{Daily Fee} & \$25 + \mbox{GST} \\ \mbox{Monthly Fee} & \$50 + \mbox{GST} \\ \mbox{Yearly Fee} & \$100 + \mbox{GST} \end{array}$ 

A Business Licence is valid for the calendar year of the application date. The calendar year runs from January 1 to December 31 of the same year.

Invoices will be mailed out within the first 2 weeks of January. Fees are due and payable by the last week in February.

Anyone operating a business without paying the associated fees is in violation of the Business Licence Bylaw 643-2018 and will be fined as outlined in the bylaw.






