
## Another Successful Hospital Fundraiser!






So, there you have it: ready for two seasons at one time! I know this is bragging here, but I think I'm getting better at these life skills all the time.







## FOREVER IN MOTION PROGRAM

There is a new class in town and its called Forever in Motion. It's a program developed by Saskatchewan Health Authority and Saskatchewan Parks and Recreation. The classes are led by Linda Jeffery, a Saskatchewan Health Authority volunteer.

Forever in Motion classes consist of a series of gentle movement exercises designed specifically for older adults and people with mobility issues. The exercises are designed to help prevent falls and to keep people in their own homes longer by increasing their flexibility, strength and balance. Falling and the subsequent health issues that surround a fall is the number one health issue facing the older adult population.

Linda was looking for a way of serving the community she has called home for the past 6.5 years. As she was familiar with Forever in Motion, due to her father leading classes for a number of years in Wilkie, when the opportunity to become a certified Forever in Motion leader presented itself, she jumped at the chance. Health and fitness have been a long time interest of hers. Linda taught salsa aerobics classes in her hometown of Calgary for a number of years. Now as an older adult herself, she knew there was a real need for classes specifically targeted to the over 50 demographic.

Linda teaches the free of charge classes at OneChurch.ca located on Broadway Street in Redvers for anyone who is interested and at the Haven for its residents. There is no need to preregister she says, just show up ready to have fun. As she teaches the classes on different days each week, Linda puts up posters all over town and on the Redvers Garage Sale site each month.

Linda stated that without the continuing support and belief in this program by OneChurch.ca, The Town of Redvers, Redvers Recreation Board as well as the Redvers Health Centre, these classes would not be possible.

### **Have you Tested Your Livestock's Water?**

We've all heard the terrible stories in the news about losing cattle due to poor water quality. There are many things that can affect surface water quality including nutrient loading from spring or summer run-off, little re-charge from the dry spring and summer, impacts from livestock drinking directly from the water source, and soil or water salinity. Many dugouts located in saline areas may be fed from the bottom with saline ground water, as well as fed by spring runoff which can affect quality and quantity of the water. Dugout water may have naturally high mineral levels to start with, and without fresh water recharge and with summer evaporation causing mineral concentration, producers may find the mineral content in the water escalates to levels not suitable for livestock consumption by fall.

A common water quality issue here is high sulphate levels which can intensify in the summer due to heat, dry conditions, and evaporation. High sulphate levels can be deadly but it most commonly interferes with metabolic processes and causes trace mineral deficiencies (especially copper, zinc and magnesium). Early symptoms include lightening of the hair coat and more curly or kinked hair. It also results in a weakened immune systems so you may see an increase in footrot or pinkeye. In more dramatic cases, there will be poor conception rates and in extreme cases, polioencephalomalacia (PEM) which is characterized by blindness, muscle tremors, staggering, head pressing, and eventually convulsions and inability to get up.

Just looking at a water sample is not indicative of water quality. The only way to determine mineral content is to have water tests done by a lab. Nearly half of the samples submitted for water quality testing this year have been in the not acceptable (2000+ mg/l) and death (7000+ mg/l) categories. Check out [www.saskatchewan.ca](http://www.saskatchewan.ca) for a list of water testing labs available or contact the Ministry of Agriculture Regional Offices for more information, for assistance in interpreting your lab results and for information on management and programs.

There are a number of options to consider if you find that your water quality is not fit for livestock consumption such as:

- Move livestock to a different site or use a different water source, however ensure that water quality is acceptable at the new site or source
- If you have a large herd, installing a water treatment system may be a cost-efficient option
- If mineral levels permit, make use of poorer quality water at certain times of the year or with less vulnerable classes of livestock
- Increase water quantity and improve water quality by keeping livestock from directly accessing the water source.

This can be done by using remote solar watering systems, nose pumps, access ramps, or pipelines.

There are cost-share funding opportunities available to producers to develop new water sources such as wells, dugouts and pipelines, as well as for fencing off water sources and installing remote watering systems. 


