Dr. Wolfgang Von Staden was born October 14, 1928 in Germany and is the oldest of six siblings. In 1953 he had immigrated to Canada and in 1962 he was the very first Veterinarian who lived and worked in Redvers, Saskatchewan. It wasn't until the year of 2000 he sold his practice. After that, from 2001 to 2007, he worked in Alberta as a Locum. In 2007 he retired at the age of 79 and moved to Regina, Saskatchewan. ### REDVERS HEALTH FOUNDATION NEWS

On September 28th, Greg Ottenbret (Minister of Rural & Remote Health), Dan d'Autremont (MLA Cannington) and Ministerial Assistant Carter Zazula met with representatives from the Rural Municipalities of Antler, Reciprocity, Storthoaks, Mount Pleasant, the Village of Storthoaks and the Towns of Redvers and Carnduff to discuss options available to increase services at the Redvers Health Centre including offering more Primary Care Services and Telehealth. The intent being that the availability of additional or increased services would allow the Physicians to complete an initial review of a patients file with a specialist, therefore reducing the number of times a patient spends travelling to urban centres. The Board will be having ongoing discussions with the Minister with the intent to have changes in place in the near future.

Just a reminder that the Redvers Health Foundation fundraiser is being held on Saturday October 13th. All funds raised are used for the benefit of the Redvers Health Centre.
