Kim Roberts and Amanda Kish opened Broadway Bakeshop on July 1, 2019.



REDVERS SKATING CLUB NEWS

The Redvers Skating Club is looking forward to another great skating season. I am happy to have Brittany Rowe take the lead with our Learn to Skate Program. Brittany is excited to pass along her knowledge and skills in skating, and may bring back the Ice Show at the end of the season. Once Brittany is a certified level 1 coach, this will help allow the club to rejoin Skate Canada. Once your skating club is a member of Skate Canada, this opens the door for skaters to compete and test at Skate Canada events. I am excited to watch the Skating Club grow back to what it use to be.

In the mean time, our Learn to Skate Program offers basic skating skills at four different levels. Once the skater completes a level they receive a ribbon and move onto the next level. Our program covers the six skills to skate: go forward, go backward, stop, turn, spin and jump. This program is open to all ages and meets once a week.

For those skaters who are curious about Figure Skating, we offer a program called Introduction to Figure Skating. We lightly touch on jumps, spins, edges and dance steps. Figure skates are required for this program.

Brittany Rowe was born in Kamloops, BC, but moved back at a very young age growing

up in Carlyle. She is 20 years old. Brittany began skating about 9 years ago and has loved it ever since. This past year she completed the last of her gold dances along with her gold skills making her a triple gold skater. Brittany completed the Can Skate course through skate Canada this past April and will be trained to instruct Can Skate by the end on October. Brittany is super excited to be coaching the Learn to Skate program this year in Redvers as well as coaching Can Skate in Carlyle.

The amazing Cheryl Bartel leads the Power Skating program. Cheryl has years of experience in the skating world. She is a major influence on so many athletes from Redvers, my self included. This program has been very successful. We usually have a waiting list of skaters wanting to enter her program. Cheryl does request that the skaters complete our Learn to Skate program before entering power skating. Cheryl will then focus on fine-tuning the mechanics of stops, stride, balance, agility, edges, turns, strength and speed. The skaters are in full hockey equipment and on the ice for 30-45 minutes of intense training. Cheryl meets with these skaters on Mondays, for ten weeks.

Due to the increase of power skating interest this year, we have asked Amber Culbertson to help work under Cheryl with the younger skaters.

Amber is more then qualified to take on this program. Amber will be working with the skaters on Tuesdays, for ten weeks.

My name is Amber Culbertson; I farm with my family south of Redvers. I grew up in Reston where I lived at the rink three nights a week. I have been skating my entire life, being coached Figure Skating by Cheryl Bartel for 13 years, I enjoyed everything about figure skating, but skills challenges were my favorite, I taught Can Skate through-out high school, and now I play hockey on our local Rec Team. I am happy to help with Power Skating this year and look forward to watching Redvers; young skaters progress their skills though the season.

Where We Have Come From

The Redvers Co-op's first priority, from their beginning date of December 1, 1949, was Petroleum.

Overhead tanks were erected in October of 1950. Joe Burnett, who was the General Manager from 1950-51, began selling fuel using his own truck to deliver it.

In 1953 increased petroleum sales meant more storage tanks were needed. These were added in 1953 and 1955.

In 1988 gas was sold from the Hardware pumps across the tracks.

In 1993 FCL constructed a Co-op Bulk Plant.

In 1997 a cardlock was built east of Redvers. This has been expanded over the years with more pumps added. Moving the cardlock to the highway location has proven to be a profitable decision.

In 2009 a triple axle fuel truck was purchased. It was the first in this area.

Our Petroleum Department works hard to meet the needs of our members.









Thank you so much for supporting our event at the Crop Inputs in July.

We had over 40 memorabilia items brought in, that spanned a good portion of the 70 years Co-op has been in our community.



KNOX UNITED CHURCH & REDVERS UNITED-LUTHERAN SHARED MINISTRY NEWS SEPTEMBER 2019

The Knox United Church congregation has a long history in Redvers – well over 100 years—predating the 1925 formation of the United Church of Canada. During that time, there have been many changes and evolutions, yet the Knox congregation itself was

(and is) the constant. Like many congregations though, Knox has gotten smaller over the last 30 years, and that, in itself, has presented some challenges and opportunities. Working together with both the Manor United Church congregation and the Dannevirke Lutheran congregation of Redvers led to the formation of the Redvers Manor United Lutheran Shared Ministry in 2002. This agreement allowed all three congregations to share in the costs of a full-time minister while also growing together based on our similarities and strengths as a community of faith and fellowship. While things have evolved since then, the Lutheran and United congregations of Redvers have worshiped together for nearly 17 years with a monthly rotation of services between the two church buildings. Over that time, we have strengthened our relationship between the United and Lutheran congregations of Redvers and (at multiple times) have discussed the idea of becoming a Shared Ministry all under one roof—in a single church.



The reality of the Shared Ministry under a single church roof has begun. Earlier in 2019, the Knox United Church AGM attendees



and church council voted to list the Knox United Church building for sale. Permission was granted from the United Church of Canada's regional council to proceed and list the church for sale. Thus, it is currently for sale. It is certainly a difficult decision to say good-bye to the home of Knox United Church services for over 90 years. However, "the church is not the building – it is the people", so the Knox United congregation will continue to be and meet weekly as we continue to evolve in our Shared Ministry. With the Knox congregation getting smaller in number (and older in age), we need to make the responsibilities of the congregation and the church council manageable for now and into the future. The financial obligation of maintaining a ministry and its properties is one that is a growing challenge with no remedy in sight. Thus, in 2018, the Knox United Church manse was sold and now we hope to sell the

church building too. It will be a hard thing to

do, but it is a course of action that we realize is prudent and necessary.

Sunday, September 29th will be the final church service at the Knox United Church building on Broadway Street in Redvers, and it will be decommissioned as the official place of worship for the Redvers Knox United congregation. As Pastor Marja Hordern is on medical leave, the September 29th service will be led by Rev. Rob Reed. The decommissioning service will be held at 3 pm at Knox with a program and potluck to follow. The September 29th event will be a day to reflect, grieve, and celebrate all things that the church building means to our lives and church community. We encourage people who may have pictures of the church and congregation to share them with us for the program. You may send pictures (preferably scanned and converted to digital images) to rmulsm@sasktel.net Written and oral remembrances are also welcome.

With the exception of September 29th, Shared Ministry Church services in September, October and beyond will be held at Dannevirke Lutheran Church. October services will follow the United Church order of service while November will follow the Lutheran order of service. Each denomination will alternate using its order of service each month, so while all Sunday services will be held at Dannevirke, both the Lutheran and United Church styles of service will continue to be used and both congregations will continue their rich traditions as the Redvers United-Lutheran Shared Ministry continues to evolve since its formation in 2002. Church services will remain at 10 a.m. each Sunday. All are welcome.
