The Redvers Town Council would like to commend the Redvers Fire Department on a job well done over the past year, especially during the LaSalle Hotel and Western Star Inn & Suites fires. Even though both fires were complete losses, the fire department proved that they have the ability, equipment and resources to fight fires of large magnitude keeping those fires contained and everyone safe.

The Fire Department has monthly meetings and training sessions where they discuss equipment, procedures, new trends, and practice hands on training. You will see these guys and gals volunteering at numerous functions and they are always around to lend a hand. "First in, Last Out" is their motto and they continue to live by this.

In 2020 they attended 9 False Alarms, 7 Structure/Equipment Fires, 4 Motor Vehicle Accidents, 10 Stubble/Grass Fires, 1 Power Line on Equipment, 1 Carbon Dioxide, 1 EMS Assist and 5 STARS Landing and Fuel Ups. They had a total of 1,535 manpower hours for active calls and 648 manpower hours for meeting and training hours.

LOWER SOURIS WATERSHED VIRTUAL WATERING SYSTEM TOUR AND CONTEST

Hosting workshops, tours and other educational events has always been important to the Lower Souris Watershed Committee. However, with COVID restrictions affecting in-person workshops, they have opted to host a Virtual Livestock Watering System Tour and Contest on Facebook instead.

There are a wide variety of watering systems out there for winter, summer and year-round use – solar, geo-thermal, pipelines, nose-pumps and more. The purpose of this group is to provide a forum for producers to post pictures and videos of their livestock watering systems along with a description of how it works. They are also given the opportunity to discuss their likes and dislikes and tips and tricks about their systems and allow for discussion and questions from other producers. This virtual tour allows producers to show systems that are working for them, suggest changes they would make, and the share ideas with other producers. It can be a great forum for producers who might be interested in installing a new system, improving an existing system or seeking any trouble-shooting ideas. There is so much knowledge, first-hand experience, and many innovative ideas out there to learn from.

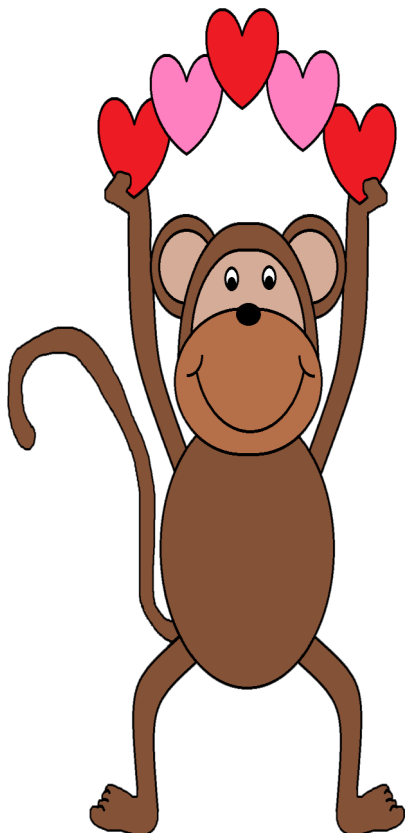
