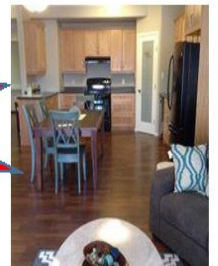

The crows and geese are back. The gophers are out. My living room window is full of trays of baby plants. It must be spring. And if that isn't enough evidence that we are shifting into a new season, the Redvers Tourism Board had their first meeting of 2021 on Monday. It's time to start planning for the summer season.

Although Covid continues to be a factor in what we can offer in 2021 we feel much better prepared than we did a year ago. Planning last year was a mad scramble with government regulations changing almost by the hour and the public unsure of what the rules were or how seriously they needed to take them. It's been quite the learning curve for all of us, but the experience and knowledge gained over the past twelve months gives us confidence that there will be a 2021 season to plan for.

It has been decided that we will offer our usual season, opening on the May Long weekend and closing on Labour Day, beginning with the shorter hours per day that we had last year but possibly adjusting to longer days once summer holidays start. Again we will be displaying fewer merchandise items but will have an assortment of popular local crafts for sale. And, of course, there will be pie and ice cream: what would the Log Cabin be without Saskatoon pie and ice cream?

For the time being Canada Day celebrations are in limbo. As vaccinations progress there may be an opportunity to celebrate in some form but for now all we can do is wait and see.

The board has a few cosmetic projects to work on this summer. The new log siding on the camp kitchen has weathered a year and is now ready to be painted, and the 105 new trees we've ordered for the gazebo area will need to be planted. And, speaking of improvements, have you seen the new kitchen and bathroom facilities the Rec board have had built out by the ball diamonds? What a wonderful addition to Redvers recreation area!

As we have done other years, Tourism looks forward to hosting a Farmer's Market again this summer. Beginning the middle of July when garden produce is ready we invite sellers and buyers to spend Wednesday afternoons at the Log Cabin. There has been some discussion on making the hours a little later in the day so that working people can take advantage of the veggies too. As well, we would be happy to expand the Farmer's Market and would welcome tables of baking, crafts, sewing, and other wares. If you are interested in this please give Lorraine a call at 306 452 7267.

Over the years the comments in our visitor's log book have mentioned what a friendly and pretty town Redvers is; our board would love to see the community expand on this reputation. With the same gusto and imagination that we used to decorate our homes and yards for Christmas, let's dig in and make our summer yards just as memorable! Make it a competition amongst neighbors for the most flowers or color coordinate with everyone on the block – have some fun with it! We place an ad in the Saskatchewan Vacation magazine every year, let's dazzle them with our flower power next year!

On a less happy note, it has come to our attention that someone has been using our Lorrain bin through the winter. It costs us – a non-profit volunteer organization – a fee to get rid of your garbage. These bins are locked for a reason, when you have to pry the lid back to shove your stuff in you know what you are doing is wrong.

SASKATCHEWAN LIQUOR AND GAMING RETAIL PERMIT

The recent announcement of the Advantage Co-op receiving a retail liquor permit

I feel it is necessary in giving your readers a understanding on Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming retail permits. In the beginning, when SLGA issued retail permits, my store and Redvers Motor Hotel were the two locations with permits based on population. These permits were to carry a monetary value when sold. In 2019 when it became known that I was interested in selling my permit, the Co-op were the first to express interest in purchasing my permit.

As my permit was only for the Town of Redvers, the Co-op's only option was to locate the liquor in their hardware store. As word got out, 17 others expressed interest including some from out of town. In fairness to all, I considered that I might have to hold an auction as was done in other communities in regard to the sale of my permit.

With the fire that destroyed the LaSalle Hotel, I was informed by SLGA their permit would be available to the Co-op food store. I want to say, I am very happy Kim and Dale Hawkins were able to sell their retail permit. They are my friends and I thank them for the business they gave me through the many years.

For me, I always wanted my permit and liquor outlet to stay on main street. Today, we are fortunate to have a vibrant business section with excellent owners and staff serving the community and area. The Covid restrictions have made it difficult for our restaurants and they deserve our support.

We welcome the new owners of the Pharmasave and look forward to the new business beside the Homestead Restaurant.

Our Agricultural dealerships are strong and we look to a great future for the Hemp plant and a possibility of another new plant to be announced.

As we serve a large area and threat of Covid, it is a reminder of how important it was or the citizens of Town and RM's of this area to push for the reopening of the Redvers Health Centre. Redvers and area has grown to be a multi-cultural community and we have been joined by wonderful Filipino families. Next door to me is a special Korean family at Family Foods. At the Homestead is a very wonderful friend that I will always hold in my heart. An African Proverb "Hold a true friend with both your hands." I hope that Proverb gets me an 18" pizza!

HAPPY EASTER!

At the Easter Vigil, we celebrate the light of Christ which we carry in the form of lighted candles, filled with hope, into a world of darkness and uncertainty. Maybe the invocation of hope seems premature to some and dangerously naïve to others. Undeniably our spirits have been dampened by the difficulty of our current times. However, when hope begins to slip away fear takes its place, and we are robbed of peace.

Easter gives us a very different sense of the present and the future. It offers a reality that is full of joy. The Resurrection of Jesus Christ proclaims that fear, terror and death are not the end of the story. Indeed, the prayers of the Easter season are unequivocal in the assurance they convey: "If we keep the memorial of the Lord's paschal solemnity in this way, listening to his word and celebrating his mysteries, then we shall have the sure hope of sharing his triumph over death and living with him in God." (Roman Missal: The Blessing of the Easter Fire and Candle)



As with the sudden blast of a trumpet, the Resurrection of the Lord interrupts the trial of his world with the unexpected: "Why do you look for the living among the dead?" (Luke 24.5). This paradoxical question was posed to the three women who arrived at the empty tomb at early dawn of the first day of the week. What they eventually discovered could not be predicted from life's natural cycles; for just as old age is not followed by youth, so Jesus' death could not naturally be followed by life. But there is nothing natural about the Resurrection. It is an event in which time and nature are themselves turned upside down and inside out. Only as an act of God is the Resurrection possible; and like all acts of God, it is a proclamation to each of us, that God who raises the dead is more real, more powerful than any crisis or setback we can ever encounter.
