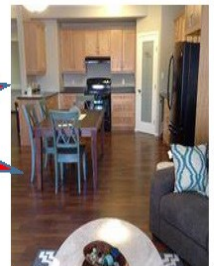

UPDATE FROM THE LOWER SOURIS WATERSHED COMMITTEE

~Lower Souris Virtual Watering System Tour~

The Lower Souris Watershed Virtual Livestock Watering System Tour and Contest group has been active and growing on Facebook. There have been a number of new videos and pictures submitted from producers showcasing a wide variety of watering systems including drainback solar watering systems, insulated troughs, pipelines, homebuilt systems and more. There has been active discussion on these posts allowing for a sharing of ideas among producers, learning different systems that are being used, what works and what doesn't, and other tips and tricks.

A big thank you to our prize sponsors for the second draw that was held on February 22. Congratulations to Tim McCannell for winning 2 bags of forage seed plus 20% off of a remaining seed order donated by Pateman Ag Ltd. (Eric Pateman). Congratulations to Walt Lockie for winning a bag of HayPro T10 forage seed from Sharpe's Crop Services in Moosomin. Support from our local businesses is greatly appreciated.

The Lower Souris Watershed Committee continues to deliver the Farm Stewardship Program (FSP) and Farm and Ranch Water Infrastructure Program (FRWIP) to assist producers with the costs of projects such as the watering systems posted in our Facebook group, seeding forages and much more.

The Farm & Ranch Water Infrastructure Program can provide 50% cost-share funding to eligible applicants for water development projects like dugouts, dugout expansions, wells, and pipelines as well as watering systems, storage tanks, and watering bowls. These are rebate projects, but producers need to be sure they meet the eligibility requirements. There is also 90% cost-share funding for decommissioning abandoned water wells to reduce the risk of ground water contamination and remove the safety concerns associated with large diameter abandoned wells. Well decommissioning projects require pre-approval prior to the work being done.

The Farm Stewardship Program provides cost-share funding to implement a variety of on-farm beneficial management practices. These include seeding tame or native forages, fencing projects around riparian areas or on native pasture, relocating livestock facilities away from water ways, creating zone maps for variable rate fertilizer application, drainage stewardship projects and more. Most of these projects require pre-approval.

Staff with the Lower Souris Watershed Committee works directly with producers to provide program information, determine project eligibility, assist with permits as needed, and prepare and submit application forms. 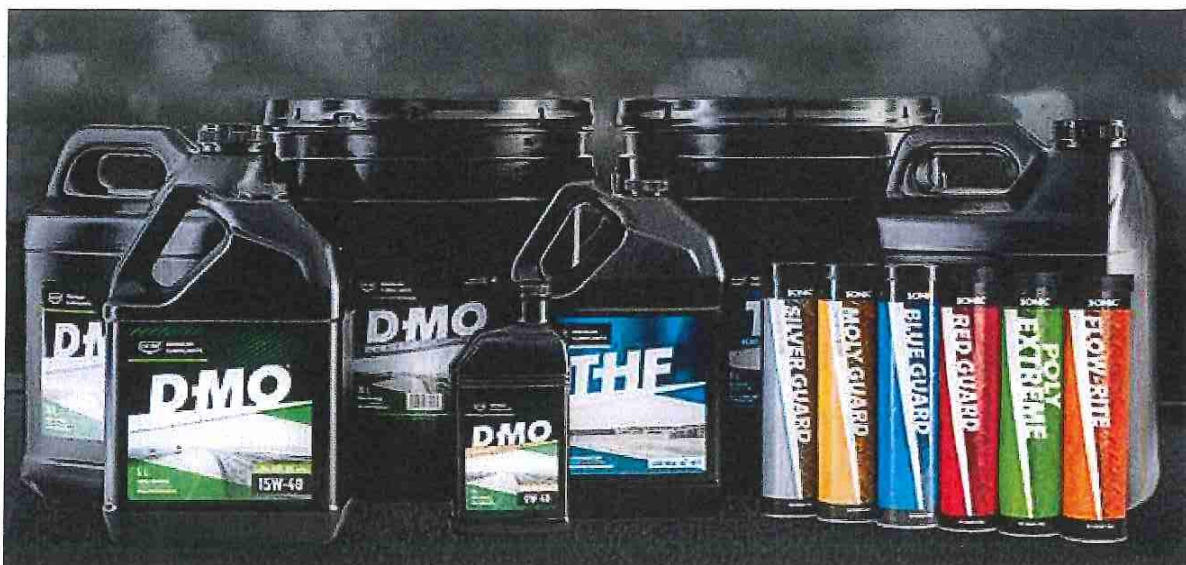

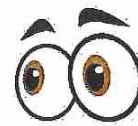

1 Tsp. salt
1/2 Tsp. pepper
3 lbs. lean beef chuck
2 Tbsp. olive oil
1 bottle of red wine
1 c. water
3 oz. tomato paste
1 med. onion in 1" dice
3 med. parsnips, peeled, in
1" pieces (or 5 carrots)
1 lg. sweet potato,

peeled, in 1" pieces
zest of 1 orange
1/4 c. fresh orange juice
2 bay leaves
1/4 Tsp. cayenne
1/4 Tsp. nutmeg
1/2 c. raisins
8 oz. wide egg noodles
2 Tbsp. butter
1/2 c. chopped parsley

Preheat oven to 325°. In a large bowl, mix flour, salt, & pepper. Cut beef into bite-sized pieces; cut off & discard well 1/2 flour mixture. Heat oil in lg. heavy, oven-proof pot with lid. In batches, quickly brown beef, transfer to plate. When all is done, deglaze pan w/ wine, scraping up brown bits. Stir in water, tomato paste, vegetables, zest & oj, seasonings & raisins. Add beef to pot & bring to boil. Cover, put in oven for 2 hrs. Just before stew is done, cook the noodles, toss w/ butter & parsley. Remove bay leaves from stew before serving. ♥
