

The summer's activities are starting to shape up at the Log Cabin! The Tourism Board met May 17 to discuss ideas and options, and to plan for the coming season. After Covid restrictions tied our hands for so many things last year it's exciting to be able to offer anything. We still aren't back to where we were pre-Covid, but things are definitely looking up!

Last year, after the roller coaster ride of constantly changing rules finally settled down, we decided to open the Log Cabin but with lower capacity and shorter hours. We are challenging everyone in Redvers to make their houses and yards a display of how great it is to live in this country. There will be two categories: the prettiest yard, and the best themed yard. These are only suggestions to get you thinking – the sky is the limit, let's see what you can come up with! There will be prizes too, paid in Chamber of Commerce bucks.

Beginning mid July we will also be hosting the Farmer's Market at the Log Cabin. We are trying out some changes this year, though. We have had requests to change the hours of operation so that working people can take advantage of the market so we have decided to try 11:00 till 2:00 this summer. Since this is over the noon hour we are offering an opportunity to sell smokies and burgers as a fund raiser. 
### Beautification Fundraiser
