#### **ROCK'N THE BLOCK 2021**

Looking back to June of this year. Council wanted to do something to give back to the community. It had been a loooong 15 months with all of the lockdowns and restrictions due to Covid 19. We felt that people were looking for an excuse to get back to normal, socialize and enjoy our friend's and neighbour's company. When the province announced its plan to re-open as of July 11, we only had a short time to plan for the event, but our goal was to make it as accessible to as many people as we could. This is when Rock'n the Block was born and organization began.

Games, cotton candy, bouncy castles, petting zoo, face painting, tractors, car show; kind of had the vibe of an old fashioned town fair, but it wasn't. These were some of the activities that showcased the street events at the inaugural Redvers Rock'n the Block Community Party held on main street Redvers on September 11, 2021. Some people also told me stories of how this event reminded them of the old "midnight madness" that the Chamber of Commerce used to organize, but, it wasn't...this was different. Maybe a hybrid of an old fashioned community fair and midnight madness, who knows?

Many of the businesses jumped on board when the organizers announced the event, some had games and events for kids, some brought in special services, some ran specials and some had food demos...it truly became a community event. There was something for everybody from 2 to 102. The kids enjoyed the petting zoo which was provided by Danielle Frederickson of Saddle Ridge Farm.

The bouncy obstacle course and zorb ball course were also hits for both the kids and the adults alike. Magician, Danny Kazam left the kids mesmerized. Cornerstone Cruiser members and friends were eager to show of their prized, valuable and gorgeous automobiles and allowed the owners to share their stories of the challenges of the restorations. Raymond Lamotte organized the antique tractor, antique toy and working model displays. I witnessed one retired farmer telling the story of how he wished he never sold his 1948 Massey Harris tractor. Everybody had a smile on their face. It was so refreshing to see all of the happiness in one place.

But, not all went as planned. At 7:13 AM the day of the event I received a text from Michelle Jensen, one of the organizers. "What is our plan?" With rain in the forecast around 5 pm, we had to make a decision on what to do with our 2 highlight events, meal on main, and the Men Without Shame social. No one wants to eat with water dripping in their plate and the band wouldn't play in the rain while holding electric guitars. To the Redvers Recreation Centre we go. A fabulous meal provided by Weir's Catering of Manor, sponsored by the Redvers Lions Club was enjoyed by about 180 people. The food was phenomenal and the laughter was infectious. That just left the headline event of the night, the Men Without Shame social. MWS is a Saskatchewan Band that has been touring the prairies since the early 80's and they did not disappoint. They opened the night with "Boys Are Back in Town" by Thin Lizzy and closed the show out with "Rock and Roll all Night" by Kiss. MWS entertained the crowd with 3--45 minute sets and had the dance floor hoppin' with a variety of hits from the 70's and 80's. There must have been a lot of sore bodies the next day, from all that dancing, of course. ALL of the profits from the social will go to the Redvers and District Recreation Centre.

Events like this don't just miraculously happen. There are many people and organizations who make this happen. To all of the volunteers, this event can not be a success without you. These volunteers include the bartenders, ticket sellers, set up and take down crews, Redvers Firefighters, Redvers Lions Club, Redvers Rec Board, Town Council and all the community members who helped. 

#### **WRITE THOSE LETTERS!**

So, here we are again, fighting for our hospital.

We had to fight to get it built. The province of Saskatchewan was well into paring down the number of hospitals in its jurisdiction and ours was slated for the chopping block but Redvers and surrounding area fought on and our modern facility was built. We thought it was a done deal, but it wasn't.

Our next dilemma was finding doctors, which is hard, and keeping those doctors, which is even harder. We have some very hard working and tenacious people working for us and have them to thank for overcoming the physician shortage and getting the doors back open on our hospital. I remember the happy day when the big 'H' went back up on our highway signs. Once more we thought our future was secure, but here we are again.

This time we are short of nurses. Make no mistake, nurses are a precious commodity, not only here in Redvers but everywhere. They are who deliver the hands-on health care. You can be tucked into a hospital bed with a doctor attending you but without a nurse your treatment stalls out. Our facility, between long term and acute, has five nursing positions vacant at the moment. As bad as that is, Covid is making the nursing shortage even worse.

To be fair, we are just one piece of the larger picture. It's not just us, it's not just rural hospitals, it's not just Saskatchewan hospitals, or even Canadian hospitals – these are not normal times. That said, we cannot sit back and think that this will all fix itself given time when vaccinations make Covid go away. Our hospital is closed right now. If we don't stand up for its reopening ASAP we will slip to the back of the line and be forgotten.

If we do nothing now we will have nothing later.

The South East Medical Group, comprised of five RMs (Argyle, Antler, Storthoaks, Mount Pleasant, and Reciprocity) and six towns (Storthoaks, Alida, Carnduff, Carievale, Gainsborough, and Redvers), have been trying to address this problem all along and have presented what they feel are innovative ideas to SHA to help mitigate the shortage situation. As that is not having an immediate effect they have asked for help – our help. They want us, everyone in this area who counts on the services they provide, to write letters of support. This is the equivalent of making a lot of noise so that the government pays attention to us and our communities. It's up to us to make sure we are not ignored.

There is a petition you can sign at the Redvers Town Office or at the Redvers Library, but an individual letter has much more impact than a list of signatures. Let's apply some real pressure.

Let's set a record for emails sent. We need letters from the guys on coffee row, from the gals making salsa, the golfers, the bike riders, the gardeners, the hockey moms, the horse club members, the retailers, the shift workers, the farmers, and the moms of toddlers. One letter per household is good, two is even better. Everyone needs healthcare at some point, if you don't want to have to drive more than an hour to see a doctor put that down in print and let the government know.

You can do this! It doesn't have to be long or technical: tell them who you are, where you live, and why we need our hospital open. Make it short, firm, and respectful and send it to <a href="mailto:redverscommunityhealth@xplornet.ca">redverscommunityhealth@xplornet.ca</a>.

#### **REDVERS ACTIVITY CENTRE**

After 17 months of our Day Program being shut down, the Redvers Activity Centre was finally able to re-open this program to about 30 people with disabilities. The Day Program reopened August 3, 2021, but had to open with some significant changes due to COVID. Before we had to shut down, we were a community-based program, and you'd always see us in Redvers or surrounding communities using the local public amenities. Since reopening, we have had to become much more creative in how we spend our days, as we are trying not to go into public venues as much due to the Agency supporting medically vulnerable people. We are all so excited to get back into the Day Program and everyone has pitched in with creative ideas. Since the reopening of the Day program, we have done

things such as swimming, barbeques, and we've privately rented walking tracks and bowling alleys to avoid the crowds. We made a video outlining why we love Redvers (which meant lots of stopping and taking pictures throughout the town), we have gone golfing and still go to the library as much as we can. When we were in lockdown, we kept in touch with our friends from other Agencies via video chat. In conjunction with the other Agencies, we started giving each other programming challenges. The fairy jars (pictured below) were one of these inter-Agency challenges. Other inter-Agency challenges have been our video about how much we love Redvers, building milk jug birdhouses, a cake decorating contest at Halloween, gingerbread houses at Christmas and we had a "Ninja" challenge for Valentine's Day where we delivered baskets of goodies and crafts to each other's Agencies for people who were locked down in their group homes during COVID. We are so grateful that the restrictions have been lifted and we can be a part of our communities again!



Until next time folks, may the road rise to meet you and friends be there for you.





#### But there's a catch

Meter reading is important. That is why after 2 missed readings, the 3rd MUST be submitted. If you think about it, that's **9 whole months** without submitting a reading for your water. If by time the 3rd billing comes around

and you haven't submitted a reading...




Studio owner, Amber, largely credits the success of the studio to the amazing team of teachers and student teachers, but also very much to the parents and students who make up their large, extended "dance family".






