Besides, it's not all bad. It literally connects us to the whole world and that's a connection we can use to our advantage. That


"share" button at the bottom of a post? That's a powerful tool at our disposal.





On Sunday, October 17<sup>th</sup>, the Redvers Lions Club canvassed the community of Redvers collecting non-perishable food, toiletries and paper products, as well as children and adult winter jackets and ski pants. Items were picked up curbside due to current

COVID conditions, with members driving down each street, collecting any bagged or boxed items that were generously donated by residents of Redvers and area.

Collected items were delivered to the Carlyle & District Food Bank which services a 100 km radius, providing essentials to those who are in need. Hampers are made up to distribute weekly to folks, and include not only non-perishable food and hygiene items, but also fresh fruit, vegetables and meat which are purchased to supplement the donations collected. The winter clothing will be made available at the current location  $202 - 2^{\text{nd}}$  Street West in the basement of the United Church.

This Lions initiative would not be possible without the overwhelming support of our friends and neighbours. There is a year-round need for the services that the local Food Bank provides. The Redvers Library has a permanent drop off bin for any non-perishable food and hygiene items. As

well, the Food Bank welcomes cash donations, as well as food donated in kind (including meat) and will issue Charitable tax receipts directly. We also learned that the Food Bank welcomes garden produce to help round out their fresh fruit and vegetable supply!




The ghosts and goblins of Haven Halloween had a trail run prior to the 31st. Corinne's imagination and ingenuity know no bounds. As you can see the residents loved


