



Proposed resolution for by-law changes:

The Redvers Activity Centre Inc. is proposing the following by-law changes through resolution at their AGM on June 15, 2022, to their members:

8.2 (a) The Board of Directors shall consist of a maximum of nine (9) directors.

To be changed to: The Board of Directors shall consist of a minimum of five (5) and a maximum of seven (7) directors.

8.5 (b) Directors may be re-elected for an indefinite number of three (3) year terms. To be changed to: 8.5 (b) Directors will be elected each year at the annual meeting to fill vacant positions.

Added new: 8.7 Following the completion of three (3) consecutive terms of three (3) years each (9 years of service), directors are required to take a rest of one (1) full year before becoming eligible again to sit as a director.

10.3 The Board of Directors shall define the duties of the officers and the employees, they deem necessary to manage the business of the Corporation.

To be changed to: The Board of Directors shall define the duties of the officers and the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) to manage the business of the Corporation.

There will also be amendments to the by-laws by way of minor grammatical changes and appropriate numerical changes as required by the amendments.

- The Redvers Cenotaph was unveiled in 1926.
- * The Redvers Homemakers Club previously held the title to the Redvers Cenotaph since September 22, 1931, until the Town of Redvers petitioned the Crown and obtained the title as of March 30, 2022.
- Following WWII, a bronze plaque was added to the cenotaph to honor the fallen soldiers.
- For many years, the Cenotaph was maintained by the Redvers Legion, and the Town of Redvers, and several Redvers residents cared for the flowers on site.
- * The Town of Redvers will continue to maintain the Cenotaph, it will remain a war memorial, and the grass and flowers will be carefully maintained by Town Staff.




