REDVERS FIRE DEPARTMENT HEAVY RESCUE TRAINING

The Redvers Fire Department was the host of Heavy Rescue Training, starting Friday, October 28 and continuing over the weekend, winding up Sunday, October 30. The training was 20 hours long and put on by an instructor from Trans-Care Rescue.


Joining the 5 Redvers Fire members were Fire Departments from Estevan, Lampman, Kisbey, Carnduff, Carievale and Esterhazy.

The course simulated scenes involving semis, heavy equipment and buses. Every scenario is treated as if it is a real life situation and the mannequin must be rescued first and treated like a real life person.

The Redvers Volunteer Fire Department has all the proper equipment necessary to perform a heavy rescue if it does happen in our area including the Paratech Rescue Struts, which is only one set of three or four sets in all of Saskatchewan. That is pretty amazing!!

The Fire Department would like to throw out a special thank you to everyone who donated the vehicles, equipment to maneuver and set up scenarios so the volunteers could participate in this important training session.

Even though there were only 5 of our local volunteer fire fighters participate in the training over the weekend, most of the team was around helping set up, look after meals and just to help out where needed.

The successful contractor is to provide or subcontract the following services:

- · Routine grounds maintenance, including snow removal and lawn care.
- Minor maintenance of common areas and rental units including regains and/or replacements.
- Accessibility to Housing Authority tenants for emergency repairs.
