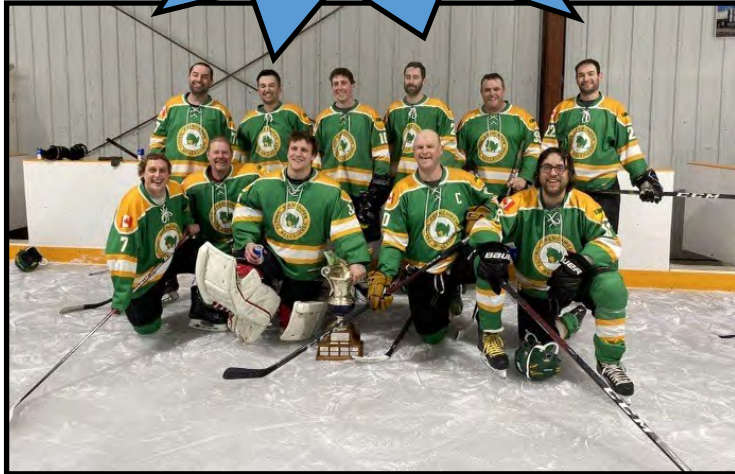

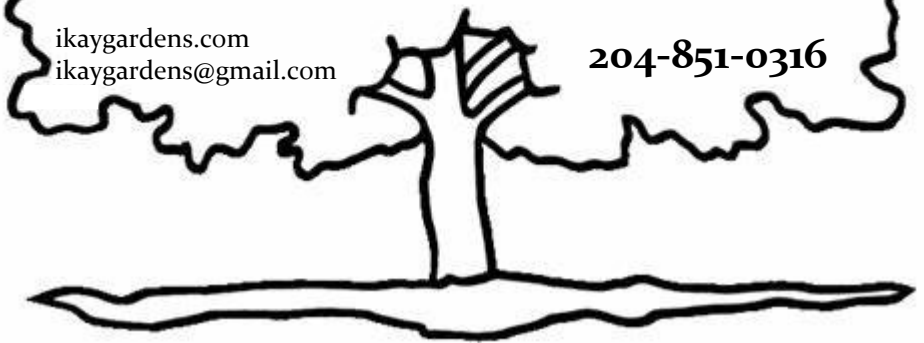

STEPPING UP OUR GAME

Well, here we are at the beginning of another year! This means lots of things to lots of people, I know, but having been on the Tourism Board for almost a decade, my focus is once again on the coming summer season. What the public sees from May to September starts in January.

This year though, there are changes that have been on our agenda since last fall and it's time to share what is new on the horizon with the public.

The move that we have already made is to switch to online booking for the Redvers Campground. As of March 1 campers will be able to book their stays with us online at a site called Letscamp. I am in the process of inputting our campground-specific information so that anyone researching what we have here in Redvers will be able to choose and book their stay. I have been very impressed how simple the website is to navigate and anticipate that if I can handle programming all the information in it's going to be a breeze for others to navigate too. In-person bookings will still be possible as well, but this will be a great asset for record keeping and accounting.

This Letscamp decision is a real step into the future, but it's not the only one.

A while back I, as the chairperson for Tourism, was invited to take part in an 8 session Zoom course on expanding tourism in our region. There were more than a dozen of us who attended from communities as far west as Bengough, north to towns on the #1 Highway and south and east to the USA and Manitoba borders. The course material was interesting and I would have to say that I learned something useful to what we do in Redvers each session. My biggest take away, though, was that I was the one and only volunteer participating.

There were a few entrepreneurs looking to expand their businesses through tourism, but the majority were actual employees working to promote tourism for their communities. Their titles varied from town to town and the funding for their position had been developed differently depending on the specific community, but it boiled down to their municipal government was putting their money where their mouth was. They wanted to put their community on the Tourism map and they realized that they had to invest in this goal. Having been on this board since 2014 I realize that there is only so much you can expect a volunteer to do – we come up with some great ideas at our meetings but the time, dedication, and energy to chase down these goals constitutes a job, not a volunteer's spare time.

Last fall I presented this idea to the board and discussions began on what this role would entail and how it could be paid for. I am happy to report that a job description has been drawn up and we will soon be advertising for the position. Our vision for the future will take this so much further than campground management (although that is still part of the job) and on to someone who will coordinate all of the entities we have to offer – Chamber of Commerce, Recreation Centre, School, Golf Club, Minor Ball, tourism, and the folks who organize events like Winterfest and Moonlight Madness. There is a real advantage in promoting the entire Redvers package over each individual organization doing its own thing. I am 100% in favour of this new direction.

The plan is to have this new position filled this spring so that the 2023 season is the start of great new things. I will be stepping down as Tourism Chairperson and Lorraine George, our dedicated campground manager for the past (ten?) years, is retiring so this is the perfect time to step up Tourism's game.
