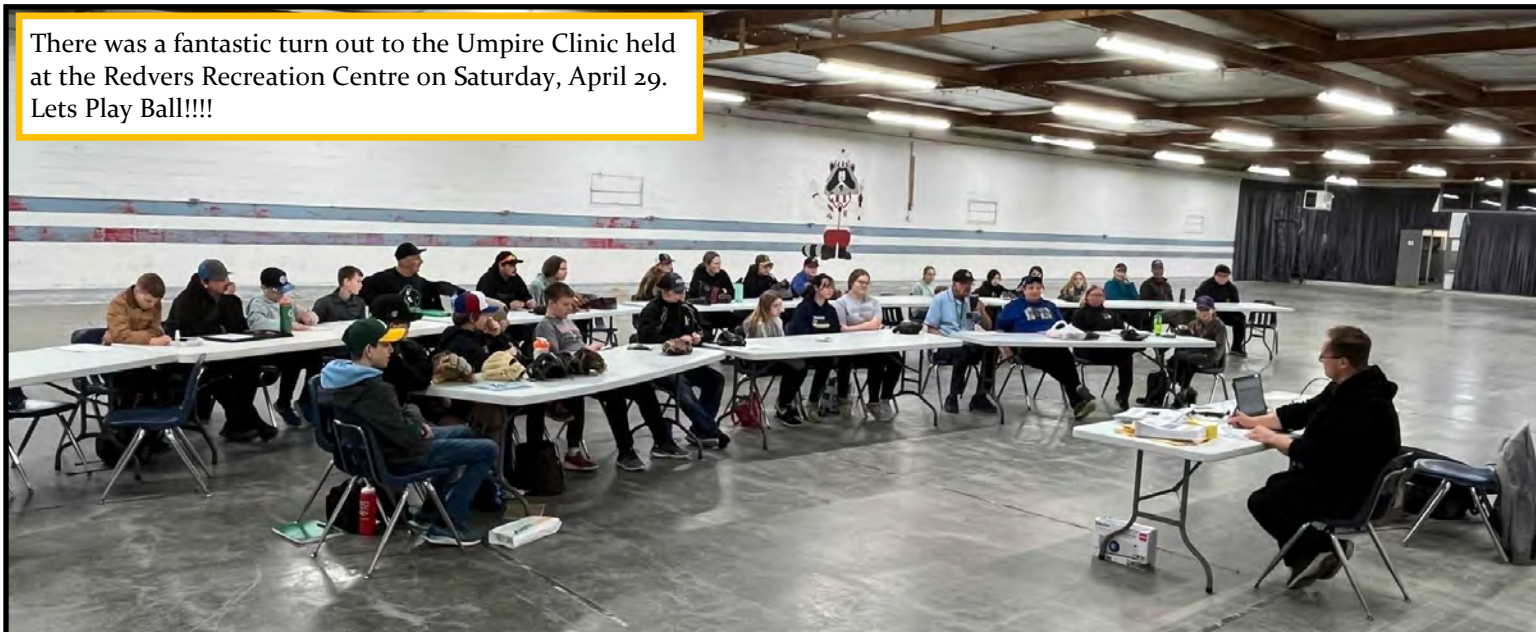

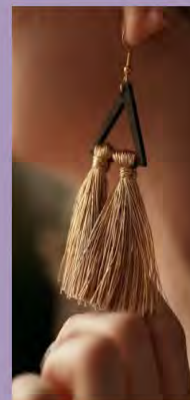

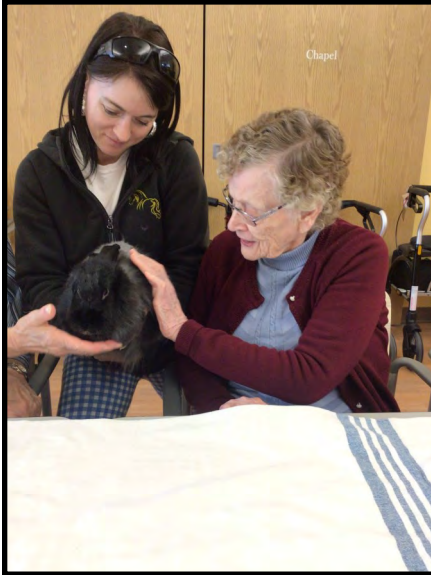


## HAVEN HAPPENINGS MAY 2023
