#### TOWN OF REDVERS MERCHANDISE MAKES IT TO IRELAND

In July 2023, Redvers McGrath emailed the Redvers Town Office, inquiring about Town of Redvers merchandise. It was a great coincidence that the Town just received their first ever clothing order a few weeks prior. He wanted some merchandise, as he was named after Sir Redvers Buller, as his great grandfather served under him.

The Town of Redvers is named for General Sir Redvers Buller, a British Army officer and recipient of the Victoria Cross, the highest award for gallantry

in the British Empire. He served as the Commander-in-Chief of the British Forces in South Africa during the first few months of the Boer War in 1900, and served in the Red River Expedition that was sent west by the Canadian government to quell the Red River Resistance in 1870. He had come through the area during that resistance, but never lived or visited the community that now has his name.

Redvers mentioned he was hoping to get across to the "Town of Redvers" to walk down main street but life gets in the way of most plans. After a few emails back and forth his items were chosen and they were shipped to Ireland! Just shy of two weeks after the items were shipped, Redvers emailed the office with a brief message and photos of his new merchandise stating his items had made it to Ireland!! 



### REC CENTRE FEASIBILITY STUDY

The Town of Redvers, together with the R.M. of Antler, Redvers & District Recreation Board, and the Redvers Arts, Culture, and Recreation Foundation have booked a feasibility study for our Rec Centre. JBB Consultants & Engineers of Winnipeg, MB, will be here in September 2023. The Town was successful in a grant application for \$43,295.25 covering 75% of the total study cost.

#### WHAT IS A FEASIBILITY STUDY AND WHY DO WE NEED IT?

A feasibility study is an in depth look at the "bones" of our rink, the structure, the roof, the pillars, the foundation, etc. This study is a key tool to determine the remaining life of our Rec Centre, the viability for continued use, as well addressing local needs. It is described as a full building nondestructive report and review consisting of:

- code compliance and analysis
- safety plan and preparedness material ventilation considerations
- a laser site scanreview of hazardous materials
- economic forecasting of possible energy savings

#### WHAT HAPPENS WITH THE RESULTS OF THE STUDY?

The whole purpose of the study is to think about the future of our Rec Centre. It may look "fine" today, but we need to plan and save for the coming years. Knowing the condition of what we have from the results of this study will determine what the future of Recreation in Redvers will be. Rec Centres are multi-million dollar projects. We either need to make a plan for renovations, or make a plan for a new building entirely. Starting the planning process now, beginning with this study, is our proactive approach. The goal is to mitigate the large upfront costs of this project, as our organizations can fundraise, save, and apply for grants starting immediately.

#### ARE WE GOING TO HAVE MORE SERVICES OFFERED IN OUR REC CENTRE?

Yes, that is our goal! With either option for the future of our Recreation Centre, the plan is to have a multi-plex, bringing more features and activities to our community.


