

SOAKING UP SUNSHINE, PONDERING HISTORY

I'll set the scene a little here: I'm sitting under the sun canopy on the top deck of yacht sailing to yet another of the islands in the Adriatic Sea. The tour excursion guide has told us repeatedly how many islands there are but my poor old brain only has so much storage capacity so I'm letting some of those details slip. We are a group of 34 and I haven't even got half the names straight yet, let alone who the married couples are. So far I haven't missed the boat or been late for dinner so I've the important things covered.

Our first two days in Croatia were rainy but we are back to hot and sunny now. Regardless, we went on the walking tours to learn about the history of the place. The details of names and dates are lost on me but the gist of it is that this region has been taken over/conquered/annexed multiple times over the last 2000 years and each period shows a different type of architecture, and depending on how much was destroyed when the next batch took over, there can be three different styles of building on the same street. (And by 'street' I mean tiny cobblestoned passage between buildings). The way my brain does pick up information I store bits of trivia, hence I know that if you see the symbol of lions with wings it means that the Venetians have been there. I'm sure that will come up in conversation some day

The first couple of days was all land tours. We travelled by bus to different places. We have hiked up and down canyons along a chain of little lakes and many many waterfalls, and we've seen several places that were used as sets for Game of Thrones. The main industry here is tourism but they also grow olives, and grapes for wine. I think today will be our third oil and wine tasting session. If I keep this up I should be pretty good at it by the time I get home!

Everyone has their own point of context though. The young people come to destinations like this to party. The older ones it's for the warmth and to see the world. While I'm in that bracket, I'm also a farmer. As the bus, and now the boat, travel past the countryside a little voice inside my head keeps asking "why on earth would anyone want to conquer this land?" There is nothing but rock. Oh, okay, there's the olives and the wine thing, but really? There has got to be easier places to plant them!

Regardless, they came and they conquered.

Repeatedly.

This morning as the party crowd and the adventurers swim off the back of the boat I'm sitting on the upper deck and pondering the skyline. When I travel west on #1 between Swift Current and Medicine Hat the land is so open and vacant and vast. What went through the minds of the first European explorers and settlers when confronted with such endlessness? Weren't they afraid of the unknown?

And now I gaze out over the Adriatic Sea from my perch on the top deck of a modern yacht and try to put myself in the shoes of those first mariners in their tiny wooden boats. How fearless they must have been. How did they know where to go? How did they stay safe from storms and dangerous shores?

Maybe they didn't conquer for any other reason than they had found solid ground and weren't going to give it up again.



Obituary for Bill Curle 1938-2023



William (Bill) George Curle, husband, father, grandfather, brother, businessman, entrepreneur, former mayor, volunteer, restaurateur, farmer, gardener, hunter, camper, fisherman, home-flipper, crop-checker, unpatented gadget inventor, prankster and teller of the most groan-worthy dad jokes, died unexpectedly on Monday, September 11.

Bill was born June 2, 1938, in Redvers SK, the third child of Marion (McLean) and Andy Curle and younger brother and sometimes accomplice to Andrea, Dick and later, younger brother Monte.

He married his main squeeze Leona Carriere, a bank teller, over 60 years ago, with whom they had multiple businesses together and two girls Debra Curle of Malta and Christine Curle of Winnipeg.

He taught them to stock shelves in the grocery store, butcher meat, shoot a rifle, change a flat tire and to have the courage to create lives on their own terms.

He had a lifelong love affair with apple pie, Kit-Kat chocolate bars, Crown Royal,

cinnamon buns, Seinfeld and James Bond.

Bill lived his entire life in Redvers, SK and left school to work for his family's grocery business, eventually purchasing the business in 1961. Partners in business and life, Leona and Bill worked side by side in the IGA store for decades, until selling in 1992. He was proud of the new building they built, the largest grocery store in the area at the time. Serial entrepreneurs, Bill and Leona owned and operated many other businesses in town over the years, if he saw a need in the community, he would try to fill it, and make a buck doing it if he could! Bill and Leona owned a trailer business selling campers in the 70's, built and operated a seasonal fast-food restaurant called the Redvers Drive-Inn, a portable sign business, and a furniture and jewelry store, to name a few. Shortly after "retiring" from the grocery store, Bill decided he wanted to be a farmer at the age of 54. He had been a "town-kid" his whole life and had worn a tie to work for much of it but the challenge to learn how to do something new always excited him. He farmed for 7 years and from all accounts, was darned good at it. Bill had a lot of civic pride and volunteered for many community organizations. He spent 40 years on the Chamber of Commerce, was on the board of directors for the Redvers Activity Centre, coached minor hockey, chaired the Redvers Centennial Celebration Committee, was active with the Redvers Wildlife Federation, Redvers Tourism and the Redvers History Book to name a few. In his real "retirement" years Bill took pride in caring for his yard and garden, he loved the days when his seed catalogues would start to arrive. He was a planner and a doer and always said "if there was time to lean, there was time to clean".

Most of all Bill loved his family and his friends. He will be dearly missed and forever in our hearts.

Bill is predeceased by his parents Andy and Marion Curle, Leona's parents Aimie and Yvonne Carriere, brothers-in-law Andy Carriere and Neville Wells, sister-in-law Vivian Curle, nephews Denis Jonasson and Brian Raimbault, niece Duana Jonasson, and his beloved dogs Lassie 1 through 3, Duke and Tuffy. He leaves to mourn his wife Leona, daughter Debra (Olivier Normand), daughter Christine (Jamie Brewster), and two grandchildren he adored Charleigh Haynes and Jack Brewster, siblings Richard Curle, Andrea Jonasson (Ed), Monte Curle (Linda), sisters-in-law Claire Madsen, Denise Paulsen (Arthur), Aline Rioux, and numerous nieces, nephews and special friends.




