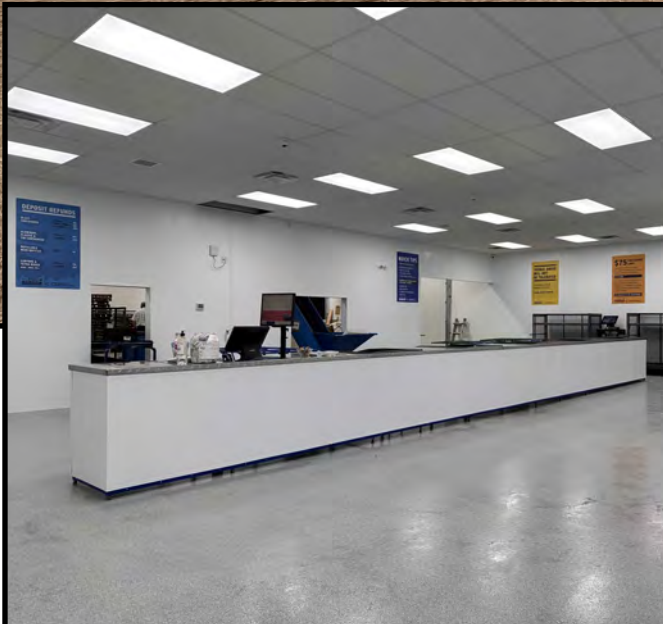

## SARCAN CELEBRATES THE OPENING OF A BRAND NEW RECYCLING DEPOT IN REDVERS

SARCAN Recycling is celebrating the opening of a brand new, modern, and efficient recycling depot in Redvers on Friday, October 6th. This new depot is located very close to the old location, moving just across Red Coat Trail, west of Nelson Motors & Equipment, at 2 Larsen Road. The newest SARCAN Depot is open to the public Tuesday to Saturday, from 9:00AM to 5:00PM, closing for lunch (12 pm – 1 pm) on Wednesdays.

The new depot on Larsen Road is much larger than the former depot, with a more spacious customer reception area and more space for serving customers. The space for Drop & Go – SARCAN's skip-theline service that allows customers to create an account, drop off their recycling, and receive their refund payment later through e-Transfer, PayPal, or cheque-pickup – has also been enhanced, allowing for even quicker visits. The new depot also has larger capacity for serving bulk customers, such as bottle drive fundraisers, restaurants, bars, and businesses, as well as a larger parking lot, hand washing facilities, and automatic power doors to help with accessibility.

This relocation is a result of increased demand for SARCAN's services. The volume of beverage containers, paint, electronics, and batteries collected by our team of recyclers at the Redvers depot, operated by Redvers Activity Center, has been growing steadily over the past few years. Nearly 7,000 customers visited last year, bringing in over 3.5 million beverage containers.

"For the past 35 years SARCAN recycling has been a leader in environmental protection, creating employment opportunities for people of all abilities, and building up the communities we serve." Says SARC and SARCAN Recycling's Executive Director, Amy McNeil "So, we couldn't be more excited to be opening this brand-new, bigger, brighter, and better building for the community of Redvers, who have been dedicated and loyal recyclers for decades."

SARCAN's team of over 900 employees collects and recycles over 490 million beverage containers each year, serving over 1.5 million customers in 65 communities across Saskatchewan. Beyond beverage containers, SARCAN also responsibly recycles household paint, end-of-life electronics, and household batteries in every one of its recycling depots.







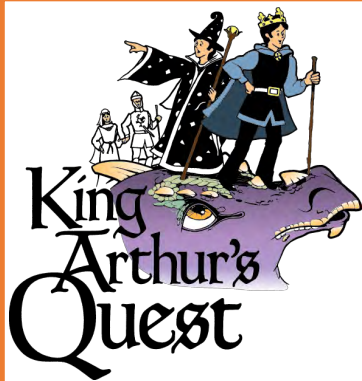

## THE REDVERS ARTS COUNCIL & MISSOULA CHILDREN'S THEATRE PRESENTS A MAJESTIC JOURNEY IN "KING ARTHUR'S QUEST"

After 10 long years the Redvers Arts Council is proud to bring back Missoula Children's Theatre to our community. The board is excited to give students the opportunity to display their talents and creativity on stage with acting, singing or working backstage. The Arts Council has covered the MCT booking fee for \$3500 USD which includes open audition, intensive rehearsals, two public performances and three enrichment workshops. What an opportunity for our local young talent! Audition on Monday! Show on Friday!

The production of the play *King Arthur's Quest* requires 50-60 local students, in kindergarten to grade 12, to audition for free and be cast in such various roles as King Arthur, Guinevere, Merlin, the Raven, the knights, the squires, the lady of the lake and the Minis. MCT will also be looking for students to become assistant directors. We need students who would like to be seen on stage and those who would prefer to help behind the scenes.

Auditions will be held on Monday, November 27 (3:30-5:30) at the Redvers School Gymnasium. Rehearsals will be conducted Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 3:30 to 7:45 at the Redvers School. Most cast members will be required for the full rehearsal time, but typically, the younger children will be done in a shorter time. Those auditioning must have a clear schedule for the entire week if selected, be able to attend all rehearsals required for their role and be available for all scheduled performances. A detailed rehearsal schedule will be distributed at the conclusion of the audition. There is no guarantee that everyone who auditions will be cast in the play.

The final performance will take place on Friday, December 1 at the Redvers School Gym. Tentatively we have two show times scheduled at 4:30 and 6:30. Note that students do not have school on Dec. 1, and a rehearsal may take place earlier on this day. We will be selling advance tickets to the public for \$10/ticket, during the week of rehearsals, for the final performance. Tickets will be sold during rehearsal on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 4:00-7:00 at the school, Murray's Store (Address #8 Broadway St, Redvers) or contact Melissa Toms to make other arrangements to purchase tickets.

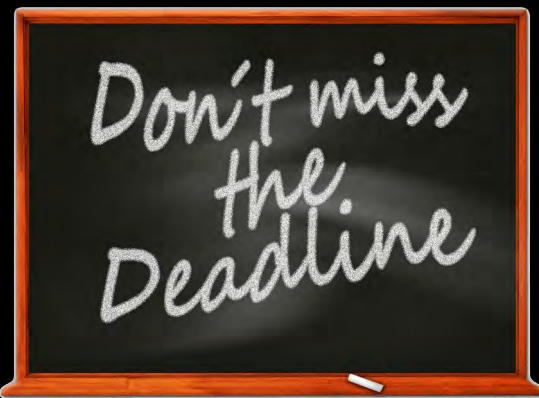
