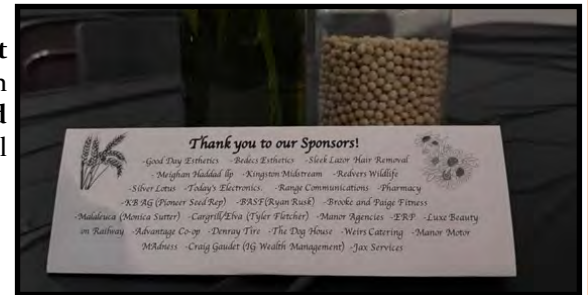

## AG SAFETY DAY EDUCATES AND INSPIRES IN REDVERS

Students from Maryfield, Bellegarde, and Redvers schools gathered in Redvers on April 9 for the highly anticipated Ag Safety Day, an event designed to teach youth about safety in both agricultural and household settings. The event welcomed students from Grades 1 through 6, with two activity circuits tailored to different age groups.

Each station offered 15-minute interactive sessions covering a wide range of safety topics including animal safety, grain safety, water and electricity safety, fire extinguisher use, hand washing, ATV and bike safety, drug and alcohol awareness, and how and when to call 911. Younger students (Grades 1-3) and older ones (Grades 4-6) navigated through their respective circuits with the help of dedicated volunteers and teachers.

The day ended with a highlight demonstration by the Redvers Fire Department on how to safely extinguish a grease fire—an engaging finale for students and adults alike. Meanwhile, the Maryfield Fire Department showcased their new fire engine, drawing excitement from students who were amazed to see a steering wheel positioned in the center of the cab.

Volunteers were treated to a delicious lunch provided by the Redvers Activity Centre, and all attendees enjoyed tasty afternoon snacks generously donated by Rising Phoenix Cafe.

Feedback from students and even parents was overwhelmingly positive, with many walking away with new knowledge. A huge thank you goes out to the planning committee (pictured, with Katy Soroka absent) and the many sponsors who helped make the day a success.

Ag Safety Day takes place every two years, and next year organizers are planning a new event focused on vehicle rollover scenarios for high school students.

# Golf Cart Bylaw

## Take Note:

**SGI gave municipalities the autonomy to allow use of golf carts on their roadways, but are also responsible for enforcement of improper use.**

**The Town of Redvers has determined that our current Bylaw will remain in effect; that golf carts may be used on the Rec Grounds, and travelling the most direct route to and from their residence.**



-  Use the most direct route, obeying rules of the road.
-  Must have minimum of a valid Class 7 License
-  Do not use at parks or playgrounds other than those on the Rec Grounds
-  Do not use on sidewalks or boulevards
-  Carry a minimum of \$200,000 liability insurance
-  Travel is permitted from your residence to the Rec Grounds (Golf Course, Ball Diamonds, Campground, Rec Centre, Log Cabin area)

# Do You Need a Building Permit?

## STRUCTURAL RENOVATIONS

- Gutting/renewing/renovating the building, replacing electrical or plumbing components that require opening walls/floors.
- Door or window replacement that requires a change of the opening or a new opening.
- Adding, removing, altering or replacing walls, stairs, or doors.
- Basement/foundation alteration or development.
- Structural framing.
- Creating a bedroom from an existing space.



## DECKS

- Any deck 2 ft tall & over.
- Any deck 100 sq ft & over.
- Tall decks that are underside do not require a permit.
- Low decks of any size do not require a permit.
- Handrails on stairs and railings on tall decks are required.
- Roofs over decks.
- Wheelchair accessible ramps.



## NEW BUILDINGS

- Accessory buildings such as a garden shed, 100 sq ft & over in size.
- Sheds that are built elsewhere and moved in.
- RTM's, mobile/modular homes, build-on-site homes.
- Garages, attached or detached
- Additions or sun rooms.
- Temporary buildings/structures.
- Fireplaces/wood burning stoves.
- Change in the type of use, converting to commercial, and/or change in occupancy load.

## Did You Know The Following Projects Require Permits?

**Demolishing a Building** - including a partial removal, so it can be removed from your SAMA Property Report, therefore you no longer have to pay taxes on that structure for the upcoming tax year. Ensuring proper demolition and removal of all debris to an approved disposal location.

**Moving a Building** - so that you can ensure the integrity of the structure was not compromised during the move and also to ensure that it was built to code in the first place, which may be common in older buildings and structures.

**Building/Altering a Fence/Hedge** - property lines will be marked to ensure the entirety of your fence is constructed on your property. If it is built on/over the property line, you will be sharing ownership and rights to your fence by default, which we do not want to happen.

**THESE ARE EXAMPLES ONLY - PLEASE INQUIRE BEFORE YOU PROCEED.**

**Building Permits ensure that all users of the proposed structure can trust it was built correctly and safely according to the Government of Saskatchewan's Building and Construction Codes.**



# Frequently Asked Questions

## HOW LONG DOES THE PERMIT PROCESS TAKE?

The first step is a development permit which is taken to Town Council, ensuring compliance with the Town's Building & Zoning Bylaws, and our Community Plan. The fee for this stage is refundable if completed in 2 years! The Building Permit is next, which is sent to our contracted building inspectors, Municode. This two-step process could take anywhere from 4-6 weeks, so submit your permit early to avoid delays in your project.

## SHOULD I WAIT UNTIL I START MY PROJECT TO GET A PERMIT?

We highly recommend starting your permit sooner than later! The development and building permits do not expire until two years after the date at which you submit your application. This means there is no rush to complete the project if your timeline extends into multiple years. It is important to include ALL phases of your project in the single permit - and if you decide to not continue with one component, just inform your building inspector!

## WILL I BE CHARGED EXTRA FEES FOR INSPECTIONS?

Unless there are special circumstances such as project complications or major changes, Municode will not charge you additional fees for your permit. If you request additional services, they may charge you directly, but not without your consent. Plan reviews, inspections, and communication are included with your one-time fee collected at the Town Office when you submit the building permit paperwork.

## WHO DO I TALK TO IF I HAVE QUESTIONS ABOUT MY ACTIVE PERMIT?

While the Town Office is always here to help in any way possible, your building inspector can clarify any questions you may have! This service is part of the fees you have paid for your permit, so do not be afraid to call your inspector for advice. It is also your responsibility to call your inspector when your project is ready for the next inspection - so please schedule your inspections ahead of time to avoid delays!

## WHEN DID RENOVATIONS BECOME PART OF THE PERMIT PROCESS?

In 2015, Council began to require permits for interior work on residential and commercial projects. Each project is different, and it is important to remember that the Town Office can not divulge confidential information about another project. We guarantee that no project is overlooked, excused, or above our bylaws or permit process. Work completed before 2015 is grandfathered in.

## HOW MUCH DOES A BUILDING PERMIT COST?

Building Permit fees are directly related to the monetary value of your construction! Municode charges \$3.55 per \$1000.00 of your project value, with a minimum fee of \$200.00. In 2023 Council switched from PBI to Municode, partially in part to their simplified form process and their affordable fees. The permit process is not meant to be costly - it is meant to ensure the safety of our residents and that their projects are safe to use!

## Tackle These Projects Without a Permit!

Painting, roofing (tin/shingling), replacing same-size windows/doors, flooring, shelving/cabinets, gazebos, pergolas, or any changes that are purely cosmetic such as interior decorating.

# Best practice is to call and ask!

Even if you do not need a permit, you will receive a Permit Acknowledgement Form that states your project may proceed without a formal Building Permit.

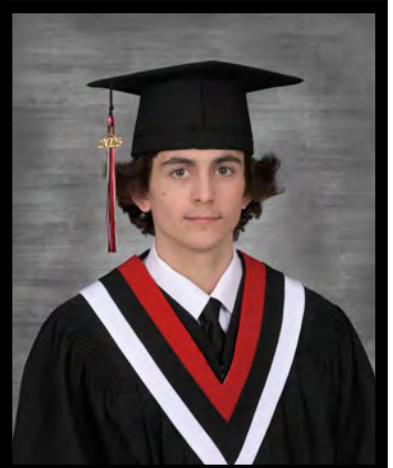

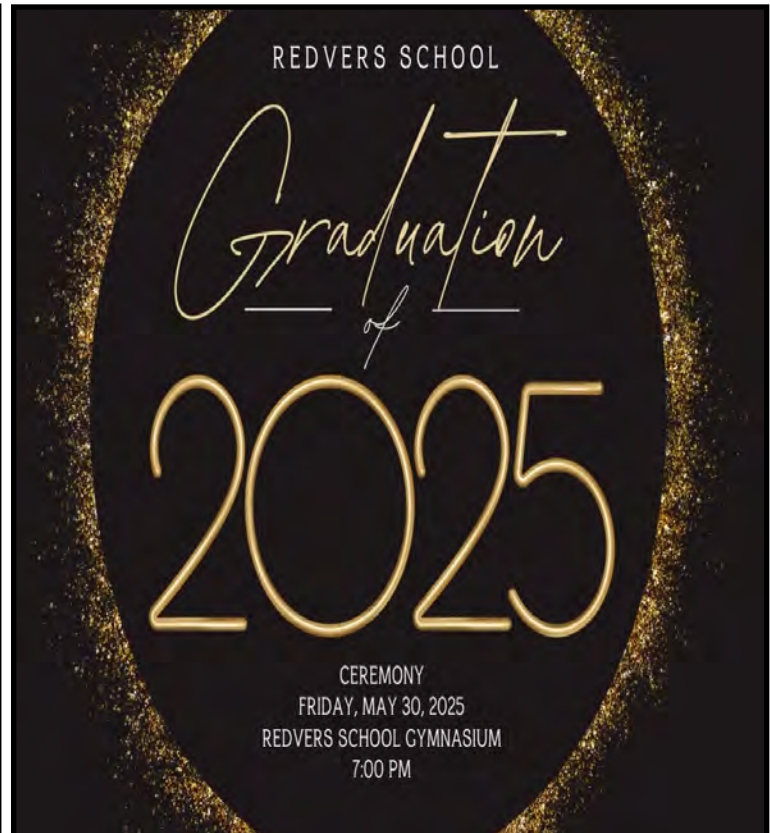

## JUST LIKE GRANDMA USED TO MAKE IT

A while ago I received a phone call from my daughter asking for my recipe for cheese cake. Although it neither 'my' recipe, nor is it actually 'cheesecake', I knew what she was talking about and went to dig out the recipe book it's in. It's been a while since I've made that dessert so it took me a bit of a search. I have a full shelf of old-fashioned, spill-stained, dog-eared, beat-up recipe books and could only remember the one I was looking for was a local fundraiser project I had inherited from my grandmother's belongings. I had the idea it was the one the Redvers Lodge of the O.O.R.P. put together in 1967 but that's the one that the banana bread recipe is in. Turns out the PHILADELPHIA CREAM CHEESE CAKE is in 'Kitchen Kapers', a book compiled by the Golden Age Center back when their address was where The Optimist Café is now.



Obviously my recipe book shelf is a historical reference site.

Anyway, back to my daughter and her request. Her son had chosen grandma's cherry cheesecake for his birthday cake. Of course he thought that meant it was my cake but we need to go back at least one more generation to get to the rightful grandmother and yet another generation to the original owner of the recipe book. I know my mom used this recipe because it's her writing that says the cup of icing sugar is too much - the first modification in it's journey to 2025.

To begin with I was going to just snap a picture of the page and text it to the cake baker but thought the better of it when I realized the deletion of icing sugar was only the beginning of the alterations. I have tweaked it a few times myself.

I don't use a whole box of graham crumbs - that's way too much. I use 2/3rds of a box and then let the rest go stale in my cupboard.

The ½ cup of melted butter is actually margarine.

The 8 oz package of cream cheese is accurate, but the womenfolk in our family use real whipping cream - Dream Whip just seems wrong for people who grew up on a dairy farm.

As far as the can of cherry pie filling goes, I never feel that one can is enough but two is definitely too much. I know this because I tried it; who knew too much of a good thing is no longer a good thing? Using only 1 ½ cans of cherries would have a ½ can going bad in my fridge and that seems like more of a waste than a 1/3 box of graham crumbs so I settled on just the single can.

I suppose, if I got all thrifty and technical I could use a bigger pan, all of the graham crumbs, and two full cans of cherries but then I would need more margarine, cream cheese and whipping cream ... I can't remember which (or how many) of my teachers told my skeptical younger self that I would need math and fractions in my adult life, but here we are. In the end, for practical purposes I choose not to build a bigger cheesecake. It would only result in a cake that wouldn't fit in my fridge, and eventually to me not fitting through doors. Best to leave that part of the recipe unaltered.

It's funny; when I looked over the list of ingredients and the method to put them together it was obvious that sending the next generation a copy of what my book said would be totally misleading. The words printed on that page are more of a list of suggestions than actual instructions. Each line is reminder of what has been changed and sometimes a note to show who changed it.

Besides, I knew she would be writing down what I gave her in her own notebook. You know, the one she'll go find when her daughter calls her someday for Grandma's cheesecake recipe. I wonder what it will look like by then?

## REDVERS AG SAFETY DAY 2025

The Redvers Agricultural Safety Committee hosted a successful Safety Day on Wednesday, April 9th at the Redvers Recreation Center bringing together students from the surrounding area to raise awareness about the importance of safety in agriculture. The event featured interactive presentations, hands-on demonstrations and informative sessions aimed at educating youth on how to stay safe on the farm and around agricultural equipment.



Redvers Fire Chief and committee board member explains “Going back a couple of years ago, I had an idea that we should do a safety day focussing on the school age children of our community. There was a Progressive Ag Safety Day hosted in 2019 that was well attended with great reviews from teachers, children, and parents. After putting some thought into it, I decided to get a board together and make this happen for Redvers. Heather Adair with Redvers EMS agreed to be assistant coordinator and then we got it rolling.”

“We contacted The Progressive Agriculture Foundation to get started on the online training that is a requirement for all coordinators to complete for the event. The we had the Saskatchewan Association of Agricultural Societies and Exhibitions (SAASE) invite our board members to their annual convention in

Yorkton to complete further training! Our volunteer board consisted of myself (Brad Hutton), Heather Adair, Breanne Barber, Channce Joannette, Shelby Joannette and Katy Soroka. We invited Kindergarten to Grade 6 students from Maryfield, Bellegarde and Redvers schools totalling 230 children. We gathered volunteers to run eighteen different safety booths and group leaders for eighteen groups of children to tour through. The day was set up to operate like a trade show style with individual booths to keep the children’s focus on that safety topic.”

A variety of safety topics were taught to the students, they included grain bin safety, auger safety, quad/ATV safety, household chemical look-alikes, large animal awareness, fire safety, home emergencies etc. There were live demonstrations with a tractor and auger to show the dangers of a PTO entanglement and what could happen if a person is caught in an auger. We also demonstrated the danger of a loader bucket coming down on a person if they happen to be playing under one. The final demonstration of the day was how to properly extinguish a grease fire on the stove with a fire blanket and what happens if you were to use water.



Overall, the day was a huge hit with all students and teachers that attended. Brad Hutton concluded by saying “We are so grateful for everyone involved including the organizing board, group leaders, session presenters, Maryfield Fire for the smoke trailer and the fire members operating it, the Redvers Activity Center for preparing and serving lunch to the volunteers and the Rising Phoenix Café for providing the afternoon snack. This day could not be possible without all the volunteers that put in the extra time to make this day a success. The sponsorship that we received and commitment to agriculture safety from the board will allow this event to continue for many years to come.”



Statement from the SAASE.ca website here: The SAASE Provincial Safety Day program began in 2012. Since then SAASE’s Agricultural Societies are hosting over 15 safety days a year, with over 5,500 students attending from schools across Saskatchewan. In 2015 over 500 volunteers – donating over 4,000 hours of their time worked on safety days to teach our children about safety. Since the program was set up, SAASE has been able to develop partnerships which include – Saskatchewan Ministry of Agriculture, Community Initiatives Fund (CIF), the Progressive Agriculture Foundation, the Canadian Agricultural Safety Association (CASA), SaskPower, Farm Credit Canada, the Saskatchewan Safety Council, and the Prairie South School Division.
