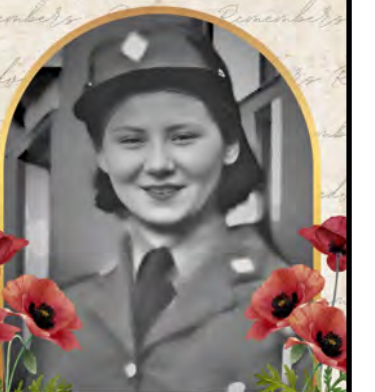

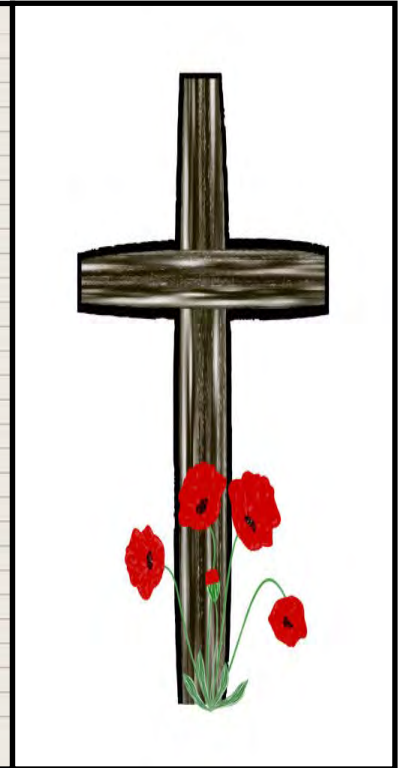

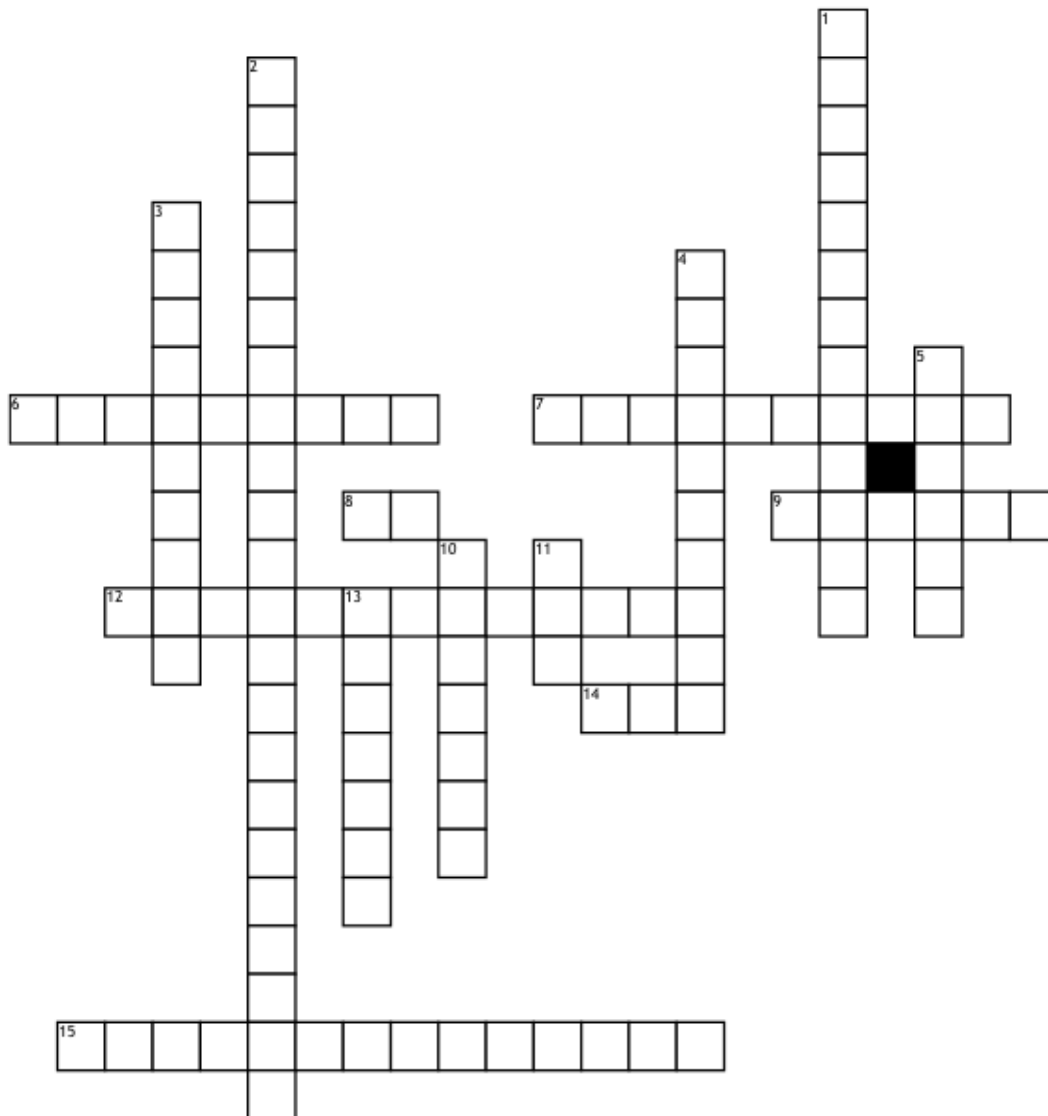

- **Pre-CanSkate:** A program designed for preschool-aged children who are new to skating.
