## REDVERS ARTS COUNCIL REVEAL NEW LOGO

The Redvers Arts Council is proud to reveal its new logo this month after requesting logo submissions from local artists. The previous logo was designed back in 2015 during the fundraising activities for the renovations of the Arts Centre. While it was a recognizable icon on the Arts Council Facebook page for years, it reflected the past and has needed an update for years. In the fall of 2025, the Redvers Arts Council board asked local artists to submit proposals for a new logo that we could carry into the future.

Perhaps it is fitting that our new logo was designed by Redvers School graduate Blessy Butong and our previous 2015 logo was drawn by one of her former Redvers School teachers, Chylisse Marchand. The new logo has several features reminiscent of Marchand's original and retains the iconic Redvers colours of red and black. The logo's components are a visualization of the Redvers Arts Council's mandate to support and promote arts and culture in our community. While the Redvers Arts Council and community has changed over the years, the Arts Council has been pursuing its mandate since it was established in 1985.

Reflecting on this process of creating the new logo, Blessy writes, *"I want to thank the Redvers Arts Council for giving me an opportunity to expand my work outside of academic projects. I always knew I wanted to give back to the town that's helped me appreciate the importance of making connections and coming together as a community, so I designed this new logo with the original icon's phrase in mind: "Please help restore the heart of our community." I see art as a core part of humanity, and sharing the cultures of differing backgrounds is what allows us to connect with one another. This belief is what I hope the new logo of the Redvers Arts Council represents."*

Blessy Butong is a generalist graphic designer and specializes in 2D & 3D digital art. She is currently completing her education in Digital Art & Design at Assiniboine College. You can informally find her graphic design work on her Instagram (blessy.bee), or check out other work under the handle citrusmoono in other platforms.

### TOWN OF REDVERS – MARCH UPDATE

It’s been another busy and productive month at the Town Office as we continue working on a variety of initiatives and planning for the months ahead.

One of our key priorities this month has been our 2026 Budget. Council recently held a budget meeting to review details. The process went smoothly, and we anticipate final approval within the next couple of weeks.

We would also like to remind residents that the 2026 Assessment Roll is now open. This year, assessment notices have only been mailed to property owners who have experienced changes, such as a recent purchase or improvements to their property. The assessment roll is open for review for a 30-day period, from March 20, 2026 to April 20, 2026. If you have questions regarding your assessment, please contact the **SAMA Weyburn Regional Office** at **306-848-2397** or toll-free at **1-800-498-0575**.

In addition, administration has been busy researching and applying for a few miscellaneous grants. We are hopeful these efforts will bring added opportunities and improvements to our community.

Our Bloom Committee met on March 24<sup>th</sup> to begin planning for the 2026 season. There is a lot of excitement as we look forward to planting flowers and enhancing the beauty of our community once again. We are always welcoming new members if you’re interested in helping keep Redvers vibrant and beautiful, please reach out to the Town Office.

We also hosted a Collaboration Meeting on March 25<sup>th</sup>, bringing together local businesses and organizations. The group shared updates on upcoming events, with a strong focus on planning this year’s Canada Day celebrations on June 30<sup>th</sup> and July 1<sup>st</sup>. Our next collaboration meeting will take place on April 15<sup>th</sup> at the Town Office, and everyone is welcome to attend.

Lastly, we are currently working on finalizing several important bylaws, including a General Penalty Bylaw, Noise Bylaw, and Nuisance Bylaw and Guide. These are expected to be completed in the coming weeks.

Thank you to everyone who continues to contribute to making our community a great place to live. We’re excited for the warmer spring weather, which always brings a fresh sense of inspiration and motivation!

## DOWN TO THE ROOT

## GARDENING ESSENTIALS

"WHERE MUDDY BOOTS MEET BIG DREAMS."



April is that beautiful, messy in-between month. The snow is (mostly) gone, the sun feels warmer, and gardeners everywhere are itching to dig in. While it may still be too early for some outdoor planting, there's plenty you can do to set yourself up for a thriving season.

April is prime time for starting seeds indoors. Tomatoes, peppers, herbs, and many flowers love a head start. A few tips for success- Use fresh seed-starting mix (not garden soil), Keep soil moist, not soggy, Give seedlings lots of light (a sunny window or grow light), Rotate trays so plants don't grow sideways chasing the sun. Grow lights 2 to 6 inches above are ideal. It's tempting to go full "spring cleanup mode," but hold back just a bit. Why? Beneficial insects are still waking up in last year's plant debris. Remove heavy debris and garbage. Leave some plant material for a few more weeks. Avoid working overly wet soil (it compacts easily!) If your perennials are overcrowded, late April is a great time to divide them.  
**Bonus: Free plants! Split and replant—or share with a friend.**

Another thing to start thinking about is, what worked (and didn't) last year. Companion planting (some plants grow better together!). Sun exposure throughout the day. Space for new varieties you've been eyeing 🧐

April gardening is all about patience and preparation. The urge to plant everything at once is real—but trust the process. A slow, steady start leads to stronger, healthier plants.



April always feels like a fresh start, doesn't it? You can feel it in the air; those slightly warmer days, the longer evenings, and that quiet sense that things are starting to wake up again. After a long winter, it's like we all get a little reset, whether we realize it or not.

There's something about this time of year that brings a bit of energy back. Maybe it's opening the windows for the first time, getting outside a little more, or just noticing the small changes happening all around us. It doesn't have to be big or dramatic, sometimes the quiet shifts are the ones that matter most.

This month's edition, we can see hockey has ended and the Greenhouse is opening, horses are splashing in the water and the snow is melting. Just another way we can see the shift of seasons coming to life again, and I'm here for it! Nothing beats the warm spring sun, birds chirping, flower buds peaking through the soil and the fresh smell of spring after a rain.

I hope as you read through, you find something that resonates with you, maybe something that inspires you, lifts you up, or simply reminds you to slow down and enjoy this season as it unfolds.

### Annual Bursary

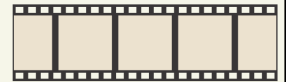

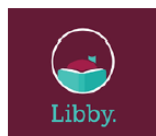
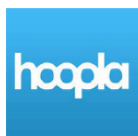

# Easter Egg Etching

Use chemistry to dissolve eggshells and create beautiful designs.

## Collect

- Three hard-boiled brown eggs
- White vinegar
- Masking tape
- Scissors
- Rubber bands
- White crayon or tapered candle
- Two clear glasses or bowls
- Large spoon
- Sponge
- Water



## Make masks

1. Wrap one of the hard-boiled eggs with a few rubber bands.
2. Cut shapes or strips out of the masking tape, and then add them to the second egg. Use your finger to smooth the tape over the shell so that liquid cannot get between the tape and the shell.
3. Use a white crayon or the end of a tapered candle to draw on the third egg.

## Etch your eggs

4. Fill a large clear glass or bowl with enough vinegar to submerge an egg. Fill the other glass or bowl with water.
5. Slowly lower the first egg into the vinegar bath using a large spoon. Wait four minutes and then remove the first egg and place it in the water bath. While waiting, observe what's happening to the egg. Can you see any bubbles?
6. Gently wipe the egg with a sponge to remove a thin layer of the unmasked parts of the shell.
7. Repeat the four minute vinegar bath and the water bath rinse with the remaining two eggs.

## Unmask your eggs!

8. Remove the tape and the rubber bands from your eggs to reveal the etched designs.

## What's happening

The calcium in eggshells make the shells strong and protects the inside of the egg. When eggs are added to acidic vinegar, the acid starts to dissolve the calcium of the shell. The longer the egg is submerged in vinegar, the more shell is removed. The masking tape, rubber bands, and wax act as masks to guard parts of the egg brown, while the unmasked part of the egg becomes a lighter shade.


## Take it further!

- Try leaving each egg in the vinegar bath for a longer period of time.
- After rinsing the egg for the first time, place it back in the vinegar bath again to repeat the process. What do you think will happen? What do you think would happen if you only dipped half of the egg in vinegar for a second bath?
- For more colors, dye white hard-boiled eggs with food coloring, let them dry, and then follow the etching instructions above.

# Easter Bunny Rolls

## Ingredients

- 2 T active dry yeast
- 1/2 cup lukewarm water
- 1/3 cup olive oil
- 1/4 cup honey
- 3 eggs
- 1 cup lukewarm low-fat milk
- 4.5-5 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 teaspoon salt

## Directions

*Recipe adapted from An Oregon Cottage's blog*

1. Dissolve the yeast in water and set aside. Mix olive oil, honey, milk, and eggs in a bowl. Mix in the yeast mixture after it has foamed up.
2. Mix 4.5 cups of flour and the salt to the wet ingredients till combined. Knead dough just until it no longer feels sticky. Add small amounts of flour as needed.
3. Cover the bowl and let the dough rise for an hour.
4. Set the dough onto a floured surface and knead a few times, then let it set for 3 minutes.
5. Divide the dough into 24 pieces and shape each piece into an egg-shaped ball. Evenly distribute the rolls onto two baking sheets. Cover, and let the rolls rise for 1 hour.
6. Preheat oven to 350F degrees. Shape the rolls by snipping small incisions with kitchen scissors to create bunny ears, a tail, and use a toothpick to make small eye indents. Bake for 20-25 minutes.
