TOWN OF REDVERS – APRIL UPDATE

Spring has arrived, and it's been a busy and exciting month at the Town Office!

We are pleased to share that the Water Treatment Plant Project is officially underway. This is a major milestone for our community, and we are excited to see this important project get started.

On April 8, 2026, Mayor Brad made an important announcement regarding the Water Treatment Plant, including the cost of services and an increase to utilities. Unfortunately, the cost of the project has significantly increased since we first received the ICIP grant in Spring 2024. We understand this impacts our residents and we are committed to keeping the community informed. Information packages are available for anyone who would like to stop by the Town Office to pick one up, or you can visit our website at www.redvers.ca for more details.

Town Council recently met with our engineers from BCL Engineering (Saskatoon) and our Water Treatment Plant contractors CCR Construction (Regina) to discuss all aspects of the project. As construction progresses, we would like to remind residents that work will be ongoing until Winter 2027. Please use extra caution when visiting areas such as the Rec Centre, ball diamonds, golf course, and surrounding spaces, as heavy equipment will be in operation.

Behind the scenes, the office has been hard at work preparing for audit season, and we have officially closed the assessment roll as of April 20th. On Monday, April 13th, one Council member and four staff attended the SUMA tradeshow in Regina, as well as a few Council members attended the SUMA convention where they connected with municipalities and gathered valuable insights to bring back to our community.

Looking ahead to the warmer months, we have hired a few summer students who will be joining us in May. We're looking forward to having them assist our maintenance team with upcoming spring and summer projects.

We are also saying goodbye to our Transfer Station Attendant, Kul Tiwari, at the end of April. We thank Kul for his contributions and wish him all the best in the future. At the same time, we would like to welcome Ron Matthewson, who will be joining our team as the new Transfer Station Attendant.

Our Bloom Committee met at the beginning of April and is planning to begin planting flowers the first week of June, weather permitting. If you are interested in joining the Bloom Committee, please contact the Town Office we would love to have you involved!

The Collaboration Committee, made up of community members, Town staff, Council, businesses, and organizations, have been actively meeting to plan Redvers Summerfest (June 30th & July 1st). These events rely heavily on community support, and we are looking for help with planning, volunteers, sponsorships, ideas, and more. Our next meeting will take place on May 7, 2026 at 12:00 PM at the Redvers Library everyone is welcome!

Laurie has been busy planning transit outings as the weather improves. Stay tuned for upcoming announcements so you can reserve your seat and join in on the fun!

Lastly, we hope everyone has been enjoying the beautiful weather. It's wonderful to see the community out and about again as the sunshine returns!

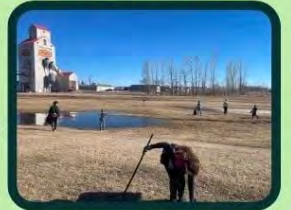
Alida and Area Beef 4-H Club **GARBAGE CLEANUP**

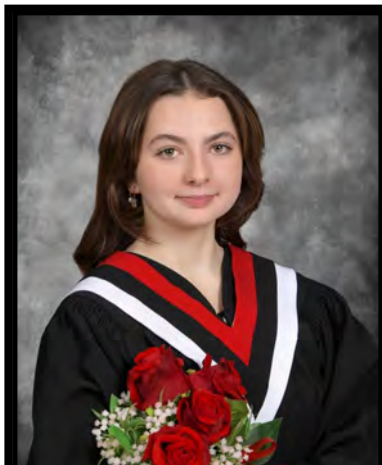

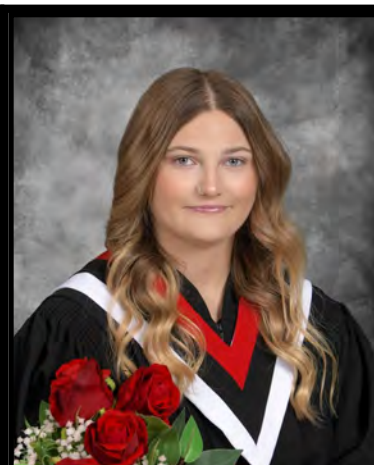

CELEBRATING 20 YEARS OF DANCE IN REDVERS: ARTEMIS DANCE MARKS A MILESTONE

For just over two decades, dance has pulsed through the heart of Redvers, shaping not only skilled performers but confident, resilient young people. As Artemis Dance celebrates this milestone, the community reflects on a journey rooted in passion, perseverance, and an unwavering love for dance.

Owner, director, and instructor Amber Sylvestre has been the driving force behind it all. Her passion for dance began years ago under the guidance of her mentor, Laurel Unger, whose legacy continues to live on in every class, rehearsal, and performance. Inspired by those early experiences, Amber set out to create something meaningful of her own—something that would give back to the community she calls home.

In the early days, Artemis Dance, then known as Redvers Dance Club, was built alongside Amber's close friend and fellow dance enthusiast, Phoebe Douglas. Together, they ran classes for both younger and older students at the Redvers Theatre. Many families still smile when they think back to watching their tiny dancer on stage, wide-eyed and learning, while Ms. Phoebe enthusiastically demonstrated every move, ensuring even the littlest performers could follow along.

Teaching dance requires far more than technical skill. It takes patience, creativity, and the ability to inspire. It means seeing potential in every student, fostering confidence, and creating an environment where individuals feel safe to express themselves. It takes heart; the kind that shows up day after day, ready to encourage, guide, and uplift. The team at Artemis Dance does all of this!

Over the years, Artemis Dance has faced its share of challenges. One of the most significant came when the Redvers Theatre burned down, leaving the studio without a home. But true to Amber's character, the passion never faltered. With the support of local organizations and community spaces, classes continued, proving that dance is not confined to a building—it lives in the people who carry it forward.

Eventually, Amber secured a permanent space, purchasing what is now known as Studio A. From that foundation, Artemis Dance has grown tremendously. What began with jazz and tap has expanded into a diverse and dynamic program including ballet, lyrical, contemporary, hip hop, musical theatre, and countless solos, duos and trios. The studio has become a place where creativity thrives and dancers of all levels can find their rhythm.

Today, Artemis Dance is supported by an incredible team of instructors, including Lilli Husband, Ayla Schwandt, Hayley Douglas, Chandler Mann along with a long list of teacher assistants. With the exception of Chandler, each of these teachers and assistants grew up under Amber's guidance—an inspiring testament to the lasting impact she has had. Her influence has not only shaped dancers but has cultivated future leaders who now carry that same passion forward.

Their role, however, goes far beyond that of an instructor. They are a team of mentors, role models, and often provide steady support for dancers and their families. They create a safe and welcoming environment where students are encouraged to be themselves, take risks, and grow—not only as dancers, but as people. Their dedication is evident in every late night, every competition weekend, and every moment spent helping a student push through nerves, illness, or self-doubt.

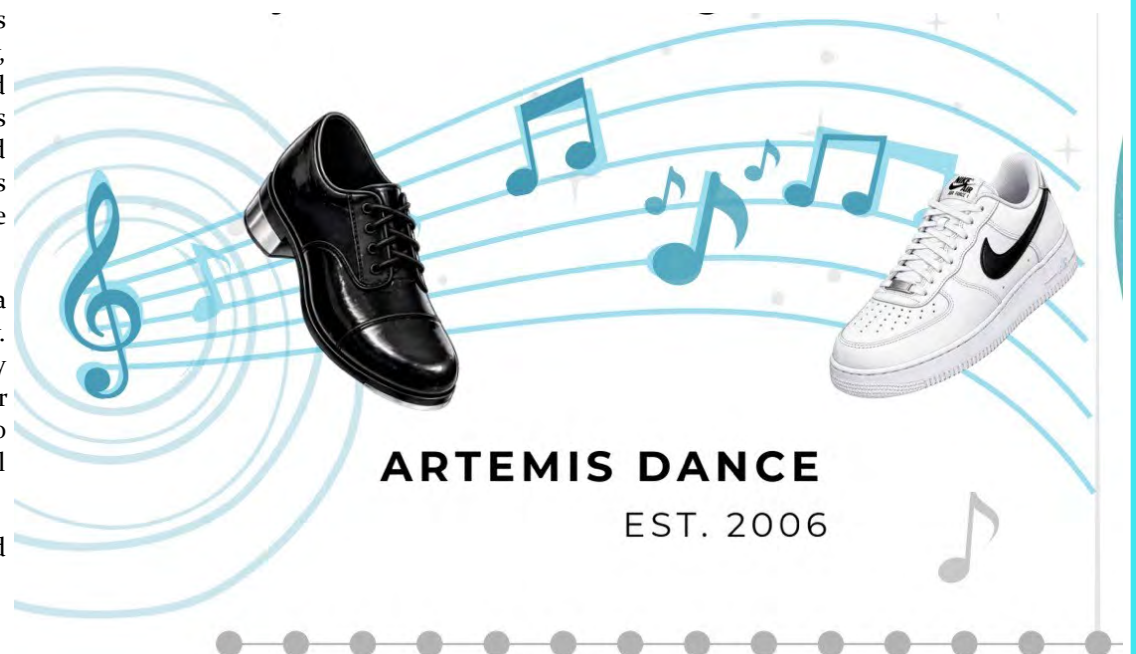
In 2025, Amber and Ayla (who is now the director of Artemis Moosomin) took another exciting step by hosting their first dance competition, the Eclipse Dance Experience. Which has already become an annual event, and plan to introduce a second competition, Eclipse Edge, in 2027—the future of dance in this community looks brighter than ever.

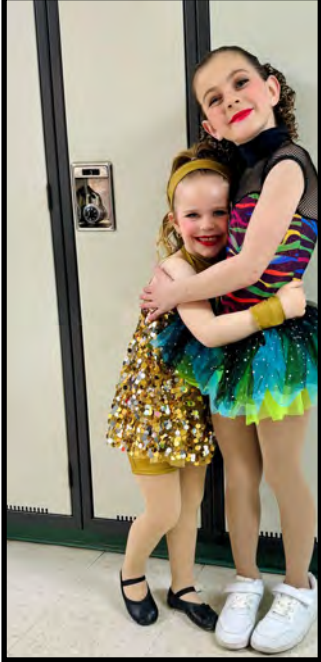

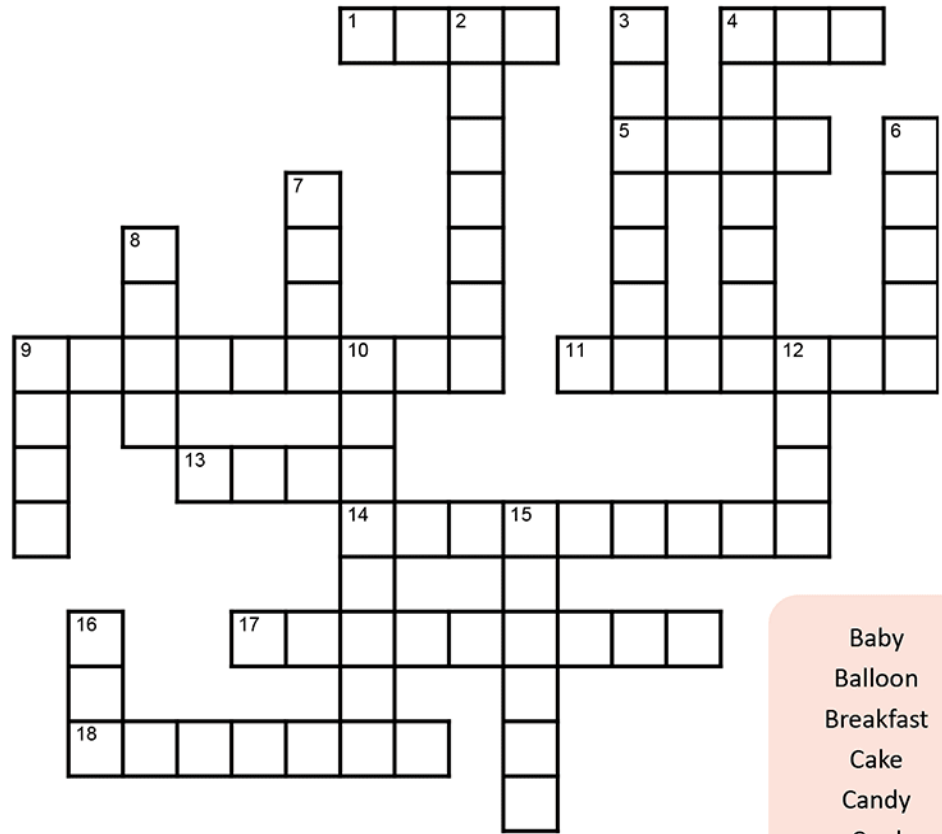

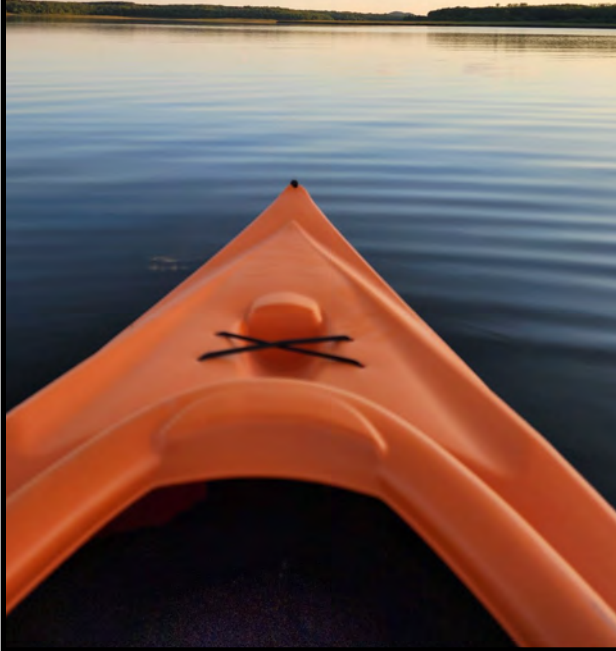

GARDENING ESSENTIALS

DO YOU WANT TO BUILD A FLOWER BASKET?



🌱 Want full, beautiful baskets all season long? It starts with the right combo of plants! It's tempting to pack your pots for that instant wow factor—but a little patience goes a long way. Too many plants can lead to crowding and extra maintenance, while too few just need time to grow in.

Start by knowing your sun hours, then you pick a Thriller. A thriller is the tallest in your Basket. But make sure your basket size can with stand the space needed from this Thriller. A Thriller can be a simple, elegant but cost effective, spike or something that will be a bigger statement to the people driving by, like a King Tut.

Next you go to your Fillers. Fillers are an easy pick because there are so many you can choose from. A few examples are petunias, calibrachoa, begonias, verbenas, the list could go on.

Some Fillers can also be Spillers.

Finish your master piece with a Spiller. Something dainty like a Creeping Jenny, or something a little bolder like a Ipomea Potato Vine.

When picking your flowers, know what care is needed. I'm always ready to help out or teach about the plants, so that you can enjoy them more.

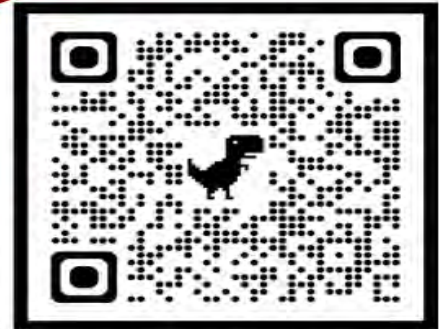

There is a small greenhouse in the back yard where low spirits can be lifted with the sight of green growing things and the smell of warm, moist earth. Our wandering spectre makes her way to this sanctuary, fighting against winds gusting to 90kph, and blinking dust out of her eyes. It snows three times as she crosses the yard, and rains twice.

Once inside she looks for something to do so that she doesn't have to leave again, but everything has to wait for the weather to smarten up. It seems very determined to not smarten up anytime soon.

With nothing else to do it will only be a matter of time and she will be back out to haunt the yard once more. This next trip will be the fifth of the day.

If those random neighbours on their occasional drives ever wonder what she's doing out there, staring at the ground as she does ... she is, by sheer force of will, willing the asparagus out of the earth. So far it has worked on three rhubarb plants, 17 tulips, and one pansy in the rock garden. Once she manages asparagus it will be all systems go! You can thank her later.
