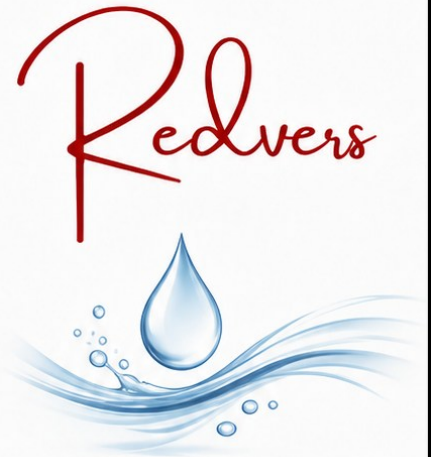



The Redvers Rockets Field of Dreams Community fundraiser project is now underway with the fields having been seeded May 25th and 26th. The 300 acres located just west of Redvers along highway 13 is managed entirely by a volunteers with many businesses supporting the cause. A designated committee reviews and evaluates the allocation of profits generated from the crop production.

The non-profit organization has been operating since 2008 and, as of December 31, 2025, has donated \$590,670.25 to support a wide range of needs, projects, and events of Redvers and surrounding communities.

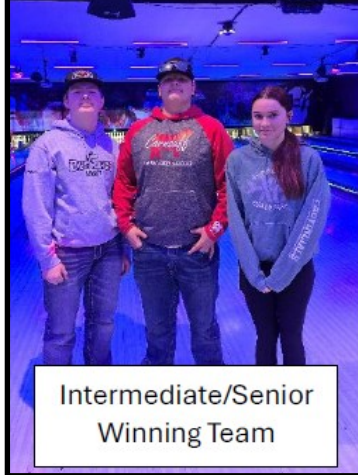

TOWN OF REDVERS – MAY UPDATE

As we move further into spring, the Town has been busy with several important projects, seasonal maintenance activities, and community initiatives.

First and foremost, we would like to thank residents for their patience and understanding as work continues on the Water Treatment Plant Upgrade Project. Throughout May, some residents may have experienced water line flushing, temporary service interruptions, reduced water pressure, or precautionary advisories while crews completed important infrastructure work. These upgrades are a major investment in the future of our community and will help ensure a safe and reliable water supply for years to come. Construction is progressing well and

remains on track for completion in Fall/Winter 2027.

Spring maintenance activities are now in full swing. Lagoon release operations, water line flushing, and street sweeping are either underway or scheduled to begin shortly, along with the many day-to-day tasks that keep our maintenance crew busy throughout the season. We would like to thank our Public Works staff for all their hard work and dedication.

The Bloom Committee has also been hard at work helping beautify our community. The Memory Pots, Cenotaph flower beds, cement circle planters, and many other flower displays have been planted. You'll also notice that the boulevard planters and hanging baskets are now out and will add some colour around town. Thank you to the volunteers who help make Redvers look its best each year.

This summer looks a little different than previous years. While we do not have a university student working with us this season, we are pleased to welcome our summer beautification students, Jack George, Kyson Gavelin, and Daxson Pickard. The students began work in May and will continue working part-time throughout June before moving to full-time hours in July and August.

Helping with grass cutting this season are Yvan Toupin and Ron Matthewson, who are both taking on a variety of roles this summer. Many residents already know Yvan as one of our casual Transit Bus drivers, and Ron has also joined our team at the Transfer Station. We appreciate their willingness to help wherever needed.

On May 21, representatives from Baker Tilly visited the Town Office to conduct the annual audits for the Town of Redvers, Recreation Centre, and Fire Department. Audit season is an important part of municipal operations, and we appreciate everyone's cooperation throughout the process.

The Town has also officially levied the 2026 property taxes. Tax notices will be mailed shortly. Residents with questions about their tax accounts or available payment options are encouraged to contact the Town Office. Please note that an information flyer regarding the upcoming water rate increase, effective July 2026, will be included with your tax notice.

Thank you to everyone who has already completed their 2026 Census! We are down to approximately 100 households remaining. **Completing the census is extremely important**, as population figures help determine the funding our community receives from government programs and grants. Lower participation can result in reduced funding, which may place additional pressure on municipal taxes to support community services and infrastructure. If you have not yet completed your census, please do so as soon as possible. If you have questions or need assistance, please call the Census Help Line at 1-888-445-0333.

The Town of Redvers is excited to announce that we will be launching a new mass notification system called **Voyant Alert** in mid-June. This system will allow the Town to quickly communicate important information to residents through voice calls, text messages, and email notifications. Watch for more details in the coming weeks, including how to sign up and ensure your contact information is up to date.

As summer approaches, we are once again compiling a list of students interested in grass-cutting opportunities throughout the community. If you or someone you know would like to be added to the list, please contact the Town Office at (306) 452-3533.

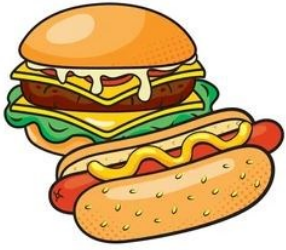

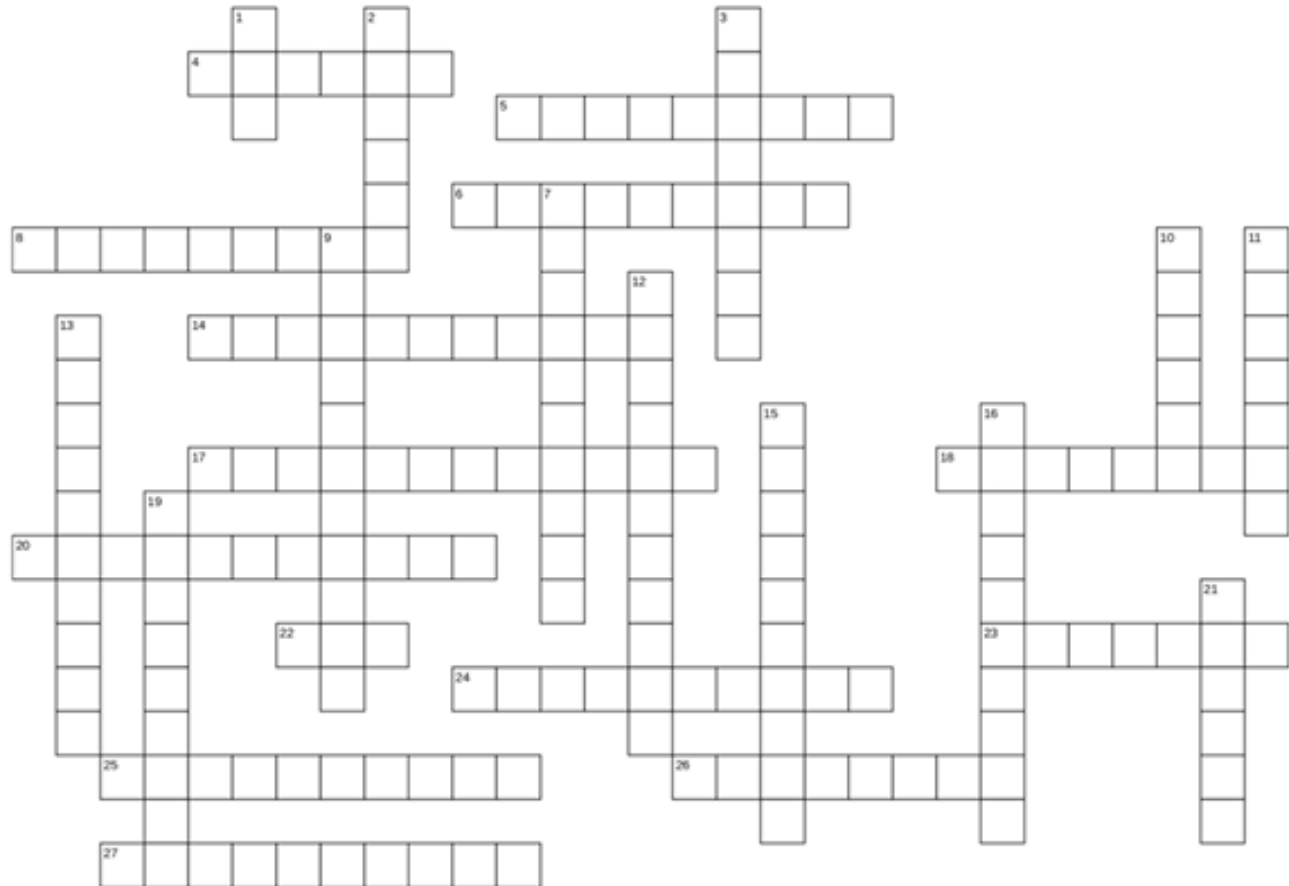

GARDENING ESSENTIALS

MAXIMIZE YOUR
GROWTH & BLOOMS



Now that you have your baskets and flowers at home, how do you keep them thriving and surviving?! A few tips to keep it all going.

DEADHEADING- Take off the finished bloom but don't forget to take the seed pod off that the bloom came out of. Your plants will put energy into making new blooms instead of putting energy into making the seeds grow.

PRUNING- Prune any leggy plant length simply by cutting back or pinching off. This encourages new branching and growth and fuller plants.

FERTILIZING- Feed your plants!! They will thank you by being bigger and more beautiful! My go to fertilizer is a Miracle Grow "Ultra Blooms" water soluble, but even a general fertilizer is better than nothing. Mix recommended amount with water and feed your plants once a week. Do not fertilize on a very hot day. Early morning or late evening is easier on the plants.

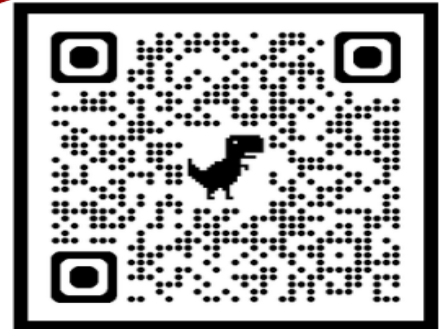
WATERING- Make sure to water the dirt under the plant, so that not to get a "Bald Spot" in your basket. Water full sun plant and smaller baskets more often than shade plants.

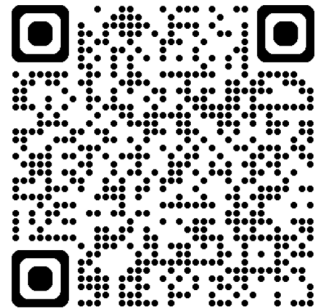

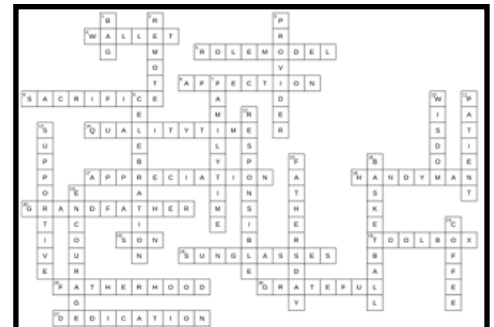
