Mayor's Year in Review –Brad Bulbuck

As we reflect on the past year, we are proud of the progress our community has made and grateful for the support, patience, and collaboration shown by residents, staff, volunteers, and community partners. Together, we've accomplished a great deal, and there is much to look forward to in the year ahead.

Highlights from 2025

One of our most significant milestones this year was the final approval of the Water Treatment Plant (WTP) plans. With this important step completed, we have now entered the tendering phase and look forward to breaking ground in the coming months.

Thanks to a generous donation from the Lions Club, we were able to add an accessible ramp, along with a new concrete sidewalk and pad, at the Hancock lot. The Lions Club also funded the construction of our new dog park, which is now open and being enjoyed by many residents and visitors.

Public safety and accessibility continued to be priorities. New pedestrian control signs were installed on Broadway Street, and new speed control signage was added at key town access points — all funded through SGI grants. We also saw continued improvements to our infrastructure, including:

- Two new catch basins installed on Souris Avenue to improve water drainage
- New curbing and pavement improvements on Warren Street near the Redvers Activity Centre
- New pavement, sidewalk, and an accessibility ramp on the north side of Souris Avenue
- Repairs to five street swales to ensure proper water movement

We also updated and reviewed our Asset Management Plan, resulting in a multi-year strategy for future road, sidewalk, and infrastructure upgrades.

In partnership with the RM of Antler #61, we ordered a brand-new fire truck — an important investment in public safety. Our Fire Department also made us proud by assisting with firefighting efforts in northern communities.

Other highlights include:

- Replacement of our transit bus, 100% funded through grants,
- Expanded transit access to include students and all community members,
- Designation of an area within the cemetery for cremation burials,
- Additional tree planting throughout town, and
- Continued beautification efforts that earned our community a "5 Blooms" rating through Communities in Bloom — a huge thank-you to our local Bloom Committee for their dedication.

Challenges Faced This Year

One of the biggest challenges was navigating the recent SAMA reassessments. Council worked hard to implement a modest tax increase while keeping fairness for ratepayers at the forefront. Another challenge was timing. Many of our projects are smaller in scale, and in today's construction environment, these can sometimes be delayed as contractors prioritize larger projects. Despite this, we are pleased with the progress made.

What We Are Most Proud Of

We are especially proud of:

- The road and sidewalk repairs, including improved accessibility ramps
- The addition of new road safety signage throughout town
- Upgrading our transit bus
- Ordering our new fire truck and the dedication shown by our Fire Department
- Achieving our Communities in Bloom success, and next year, we'll be entering the competitive category

What We're Hearing from Residents

Residents often tell us they are pleased to see continued investment in streets and sidewalks, and they appreciate the reinvestment happening throughout the community. While no one enjoys tax increases, many understand their necessity when they see visible improvements. We also frequently hear how clean, welcoming, and attractive our town is, something we can all take pride in.

Looking Ahead to 2026

In the year ahead, our focus will include:

- Securing additional grants to support future projects
- Breaking ground on the Water Treatment Plant, ideally in early spring
- Encouraging new businesses to fill vacant buildings
- Discussions on lot promotions in the Perreux Subdivision
- Developing a treed green space at the southeast entrance to town and planting more trees in strategic locations
- Further asset management particularly our underground infrastructure, pavement, sidewalks and increasing accessibility throughout our community

Reflections on Leadership

One of the most challenging aspects of being mayor is finding the balance between “needs” and “wants,” while making decisions that serve the entire community, not just one group or interest. Rising costs continue to be a challenge, which is why grant funding remains such an important tool for us. The most rewarding part of this role is seeing projects completed and hearing positive feedback from residents and visitors alike.

Looking to the Future

Our long-term goals remain focused on reinvesting in infrastructure, attracting new residents and businesses, selling lots in the new subdivision, and addressing ongoing drainage concerns. We also continue to work toward attracting a hotel to our community.

By the next municipal election, we hope to see:

- The Water Treatment Plant fully operational
- Four major sidewalk projects completed

Thank you to everyone who contributes to making our community such a wonderful place to live. Together, we are building a strong, vibrant future.



The Town of Redvers is a welcoming and vibrant community of 1,008 residents, located in the heart of southeast Saskatchewan. Although small in size, Redvers is rich in community spirit, volunteerism and pride. The following photographs offer the judges a glimpse of our community and highlight some of the features that welcome residents and visitors alike.

Pictured is the sign located at the Town Office, along with our community entrance sign on the southeast corner of town and our signature Town of Redvers sign located at the intersection of Broadway Street and Highway 13.

In 2024, Redvers further enhanced community safety with the installation of a Community SaveStation outside the Town Office. Made possible through generous funding from Steel Reef, the SaveStation provides public access to an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) and emergency response equipment, helping ensure life-saving resources are available when every second counts.





Some of our Bloom Committee members hard at work planting our memory pots, cement planters and flower beds. Our flowers are sourced from Quennelle Greenhouse which is located in Wauchope, SK, approximately –pics from 2024 & 205.



To enhance the beauty of our streetscapes, the Town continues to invest in attractive and sustainable floral displays. In 2023, four large self-watering boulevard planters were added to complement our 18 self-watering hanging planters located throughout the community. Building on that investment, one additional large self-watering boulevard planter was added in 2025, further enhancing our public spaces and creating welcoming streetscapes for residents and visitors alike.

Each year, the Bloom Committee selects a coordinated colour palette for all municipal planters and hanging baskets, creating a cohesive and visually appealing display throughout the community. These colourful floral arrangements reflect the pride our residents take in Redvers and help create an inviting atmosphere that can be enjoyed by all.

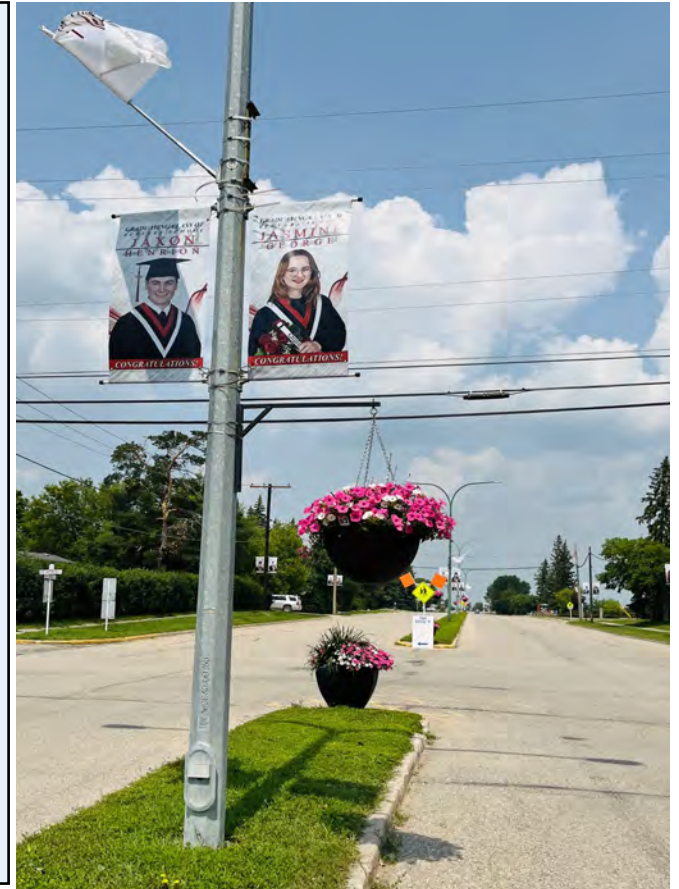

The following photographs were taken during the 2025 and 2026 growing seasons and showcase the Town of Redvers' ongoing commitment to beautification, environmental stewardship and community pride. They highlight our coordinated floral program, enhanced streetscapes, vibrant public spaces and community initiatives, including the annual graduation banner program recognizing graduates from both Redvers School and École Bellegarde School. Together, these projects reflect the dedication of our Bloom Committee, staff, volunteers, businesses and residents in creating a welcoming, inclusive and vibrant community for everyone to enjoy.



The photograph to the right was taken in 2026 and showcases the Hancock Park, located in the centre of our community. The park features a gazebo, a perennial area with massive hostas, mature shrubs and inviting green space for residents and visitors to enjoy. In 2025, an accessible concrete sidewalk was added to the seating area added in 2024, providing improved access for people of all abilities and creating a welcoming space for everyone to gather. Through generous funding from the Redvers & District Lions Club these enhancements to the park as an accessible and inclusive community gathering place were made.



The bottom three photographs highlight Larsen Park, located in the south end of town within our newest residential subdivision. This park is one of the homes to our Hometown History initiative, which honours past community members and celebrates the people and stories that have shaped Redvers. Through this program, along with generous sponsorships from local businesses and community members, we have installed eight Hometown History benches, five dog waste stations, recycling and trash receptacles, creating an attractive and functional public space. The Town continues to pursue grant opportunities and community partnerships to further enhance both parks and ensure they remain vibrant, welcoming spaces for generations to come.





In 2016 we incorporated “Memory Pots” into our beautification. Since inception these have become very popular and line Broadway Street. Community members and visitors can walk our downtown corridor and remember and reminisce about loved ones lost. In 2023 we added QR codes to those that wanted and you can scan the code and listen to a song or poem of the families choice or visit their obituary online. In 2026 we sold out at 70 Memory Pots!

In 2024, the Town of Redvers introduced a new, distinctive streetscape by replacing all traditional green-and-white street signs with custom white signs featuring red lettering and a decorative topper displaying the Town's logo. To keep the community looking fresh and festive throughout the year, the toppers were designed with interchangeable magnetic inserts, allowing seasonal decals to be displayed for occasions such as Remembrance Day, Christmas, winter celebrations and other community events. This initiative has strengthened Redvers' identity while creating a welcoming and visually appealing streetscape.

The Bloom Committee's efforts extend well beyond municipal flower beds. Our committee proudly collaborates with local organizations, schools and volunteers to enhance public spaces throughout the community. Pictured in the top right are two Bloom Committee members refreshing the Redvers School flower bed by adding additional flowers to create a fuller, more vibrant display. Throughout the summer, our beautification students help maintain these gardens by watering and caring for the plants while school is out. The committee also supports other community spaces by planting and watering flowers at the Recreation Grounds and assisting with the beautiful gardens at the Tourism Log Cabin, including the Jean Ericksen Memorial Flower Bed. These partnerships demonstrate how working together creates attractive, welcoming spaces that instill community pride and enhance the quality of life for residents and visitors alike.

To ensure our planters, hanging baskets and flower beds receive consistent care throughout the growing season, each location has been assigned a number for easy identification and tracking. In 2026, the Town employed two summer students who share the community beautification responsibilities, including watering, weeding, deadheading and general maintenance of our floral displays. We have another summer student as well who helps with a variety of maintenance tasks.

Our dedicated Bloom Committee plays an active role in maintaining the community's beauty. Each committee member has adopted a specific area of town to regularly monitor and report on through a shared WhatsApp group, allowing us to quickly identify concerns, coordinate maintenance and ensure nothing is overlooked. This collaborative approach has greatly improved communication and helps us stay organized throughout the season.

This year has presented its share of challenges, with frequent heavy rainfall, hail and strong wind storms impacting many of our floral displays. Despite these obstacles, our staff, summer students and Bloom Committee members have worked together to promptly address damage, refresh plantings where needed and keep Redvers looking its best. Their teamwork, dedication and community pride have been instrumental in maintaining the vibrant appearance of our public spaces throughout the season.





Our recreation centre, top left, is an active facility during the summer and winter months. During the winter there are many hockey games and tournaments, and during the summer, the outdoor pool keeps everyone cool and is a place for families and friends to gather. The top right picture is one of 4 ball diamonds that we have on our rec grounds. Bottom left is known as the “Cook Shack” and is used for summer programming, cookouts and the annual Knights of Columbus pancake breakfast. When people visit our community and come for a ball tournament, wedding, community event, etc. they are thrilled to find out the campground is located within the rec grounds. This makes celebrations easy to access and everyone in the same area.





Located in Redvers is the Redvers School that educates children from Kindergarten to Grade 12. Approximately 10 km southeast of Redvers is a French immersion school with students attending from Redvers and surrounding communities.

The Redvers Activity Centre is a wonderful organization for persons with disabilities. They provide programming, daily routine and job coaching for their clients. There is a building where the staff and clients attend on a daily basis, as well as three group homes located in Redvers.

Redvers is very fortunate to have a fully operation Health Centre in our community. There is 24 hour emergency, ambulance services, long term care and a medical clinic. This centre was 100% community funded and is fully operational.





The Redvers Library boasts with activities and programming throughout the year. In 2024, the Town of Redvers and the Library collaborated together to offer Senior Support Sessions which was funded by the Senior Mechanisms Fund and was well received by the community.

On the top right are pictures of our town banners that were added to our community in 2023 and our flags were added in 2024. For these we used our newly designed logo and our retro logo, both designed within our office.

On the bottom right side is what we refer to as the “Greenspace”. This is a piece of land owned by Advantage Co-op that was a gas station in the past, therefore unusable land. The Town maintains the lot and we placed 3 Memory Pots there as well as cement benches. Our Bloom Committee and Maintenance team worked hard this summer to clean this area up and trimmed the trees. We are very proud of the teamwork that went into this!





After many years of the Cenotaph not in the Town's name, we worked to acquire this piece of property. The base was painted in 2022, Memory Pots are placed here and the flower bed that surrounds the monument is planted by the Town. In 2025 the Soldier Monument will be cleaned by our Cemetery Headstone Cleaning Contractor.

Below is our cemetery which is located a few kms north of town. Although it is not directly in Town, it is Town owned and we contract the caretaking of the property to an outside person.

In 2023 we added a "Little Library" which holds a set of history books, a map of the cemetery and a document with all persons buried.

In 2024 we lost one of our large evergreen trees to a wind storm. Although tree roots can cause issues with headstones we would like to keep our tree population at the cemetery in tact and thriving.





For many years located on the northwest side of Redvers along Highway #13, there were two large highway signs recognizing two athletes that were born and raised in Redvers. Our Hometown History project included three gentlemen that impacted our community in the past. On July 29, 2024 these signs were erected and we had a sign presentation to honour these men. Their families attended the presentation and we had members from Agribition attend.

The New Redvers Transit Bus is Here!

After months of planning, anticipation, and community involvement, our brand-new transit bus has arrived!

The project was made possible through a successful application to the federal Rural Transit Solutions Fund, which awarded Redvers \$200,000 to help purchase the new vehicle. The funding is part of a national initiative aimed at improving mobility options in rural and remote areas, where transportation services are often limited.

Recognizing the need for reliable transportation—particularly for seniors, people with mobility challenges, and those without access to a personal vehicle—the Town of Redvers applied for the funding last year. The process, from approval to delivery, took several months, but the wait was well worth it as the new transit bus now stands ready to serve the community. The van we were using is 10 years old, and it was thought to take a proactive approach and replace it sooner than later.

In addition to the federal support, the purchase of the bus was made possible by significant financial contributions from Kingston Midstream, The Richardson Foundation, and Tundra Oil & Gas. Their generosity ensured that the town did not have to allocate any funds for this purchase in 2025.

The excitement around the new transit service extended beyond just the arrival of the bus. The Town of Redvers invited the public to participate in a community vote to select the decal design that would decorate the vehicle. Residents were encouraged to cast their votes, making the bus not only a practical addition but also a symbol of community pride and involvement.

Redvers Transit covers a variety of needs, providing mobility for seniors, persons with disabilities, and residents who are unable to drive.

We are incredibly grateful to the Government of Canada, The Richardson Foundation, Kingston Midstream, and Tundra Oil & Gas for recognizing the importance of rural transit and for stepping up and supporting the wellbeing of Redvers residents. This new bus will make a meaningful difference in the lives of many people in our community.





In 2025 we planted 26 trees -grant from TCTrail for \$1,600 and the Town matched that amount for a total of \$3,200. The plan moving forward is to plant a few trees each year increasing the tree canopy in our community. In 2026 we planted 15 more trees.



These are some pictures of the perennials at the Hancock Park. Our Bloom Committee has been working very hard at cleaning this space up as it has been neglected for several years. In 2025 we moved 2 cement planters to this park.

In 2025, the Town of Redvers proudly participated in the Communities in Bloom/Miracle-Gro® Best Garden Selection Program for the first year. This initiative recognizes and celebrates residents who take pride in creating and maintaining beautiful outdoor spaces while inspiring others to enhance the appearance of our community.

In 2025 the Bloom Committee toured a number of nominated properties, each showcasing its own unique character and creativity. From colourful flower beds and thriving vegetable gardens to attractive landscaping, decorative features and inviting outdoor living spaces, every property reflected the passion and dedication of its owners. The committee was especially impressed by the care taken to create spaces that support pollinators through the use of flowering plants, bird feeders, bird baths and environmentally friendly gardening practices.

Following the success of last year's program, the committee is expanding the initiative to also recognize well-maintained backyards and back alleys. The addition highlights that community beautification extends beyond what is visible from the street and celebrates tidy, welcoming outdoor spaces throughout the community.

The program generated positive community engagement as residents submitted nominations and celebrated the efforts of fellow gardeners. It encouraged conversations about gardening, environmental stewardship and neighbourhood pride while recognizing that every garden, regardless of size or style, contributes to the overall beauty and vibrancy of Redvers.

Selected recipients received a congratulatory letter from The Scotts Miracle-Gro Company in partnership with Communities in Bloom, along with a garden sign and Miracle-Gro® products in recognition of their outstanding efforts.

The Miracle-Gro® Best Garden Selection Program continues to be a meaningful way to acknowledge residents who help make Redvers a beautiful place to live, while fostering community pride, environmental awareness and a shared appreciation for gardening.

SCHEDULE A REMINDER
Solid fuel barbecues and recreational campfires are only permitted when enclosed with a metal screen, under adult supervision, with a clear extinguishment plan.
Permitted hours: Sunday–Thursday before 11:00 pm; Friday & Saturday before 1:00 am.

Water & Sewer Bylaw 2026

Bylaw No. 706-2026 – Key Information



1 Important Account Information

- Property owners are responsible for the utility account, including customer information, service connections/disconnections, and payment for services.
- Accounts must be in the property owner's legal name, matching the tax card.
- Water meters are read quarterly by the homeowner.
- If no reading is submitted after two consecutive quarters, and by the end of the month on the third consecutive quarter, a \$25 non-read fee will be added.
- Readings must be submitted during the reading period to qualify.
- Water meter deposit for all new home-owners: \$100.00
- Water meter deposits are held in trust and are refundable upon sale of the property, or transferable within the Town of Redvers.

3 Service Connection / Disconnection Fees

Regular hours – turn off water at curb stop	\$50.00
Regular hours – turn on water at curb stop	\$50.00
After hours – turn off water at curb stop	\$100.00
After hours – turn on water at curb stop	\$100.00
Turn off water in computer system	\$25.00
Turn on water in computer system	\$25.00

 A meter reading is required when water is shut off and when it is turned back on.

2 Billing, Due Dates & Fees

- Utility accounts are rendered quarterly.
- Payment is due within 30 days from the billing date.
- Unpaid accounts are charged interest at 2.9% per month.
- Water service may be cut off if accounts remain unpaid.
- Services will not be turned back on until penalties, fees, rates, charges, and arrears are paid in full.
- Infrastructure fee: \$200.00 per quarter on every account, whether services are on or off. This fee is not prorated.

4 Quarterly Rate Schedule

Town of Redvers – Water Rates	
9,000 gallons or less:	Basic water rate \$85.00
Over 9,000 gallons:	\$6.58 per 1,000 gallons
Town of Redvers – Sewer Rates	
50% of the total water charge	
Minimum sewer rate: 50% of the Basic Water Rate	
Outside Town Limits – Water Rates	
9,000 gallons or less:	Basic water rate \$146.44
Over 9,000 gallons:	\$15.35 per 1,000 gallons
Outside Town Limits – Sewer Rates	
50% of the total water charge, if sewer service exists for the property	



Effective Date: The rates, charges, tolls, or rents in this bylaw come into force **July 1, 2026**, with the interest rate effective immediately.

Businesses, Services & Community Organizations

Although Redvers is home to just over 1,000 residents, it offers an impressive range of businesses, services and organizations that contribute to a vibrant and resilient community while serving a much larger regional population. A complete directory of our businesses and organizations can be found on our website at www.redvers.ca.

A cornerstone of our community is the Redvers Fire Department, a successful partnership between the Town of Redvers and the RM of Antler No. 61. Our dedicated firefighters continually enhance their skills through ongoing training, actively pursue grant funding and ensure equipment remains modern and well maintained. Their commitment has helped secure a new fire truck valued at approximately \$800,000, with the Town, RM and Fire Department working together to fund the project. To date, approximately \$250,000 has been raised through the incredible generosity of local businesses, organizations and community members.

Redvers is also home to Head for the Hills Veterinary Services, providing care for both large and small animals, the Redvers Early Learning & Childcare Centre, two licensed day homes, and the Redvers & District Lions Dog Park, which officially opened in 2025 and has quickly become a popular gathering place for residents and their pets.

Our thriving business sector includes two grocery stores, two hardware stores, restaurants, convenience stores, fuel stations, retail shops, financial services, healthcare providers, construction companies, Ready-Mix concrete suppliers and many other locally owned businesses that support the daily needs of our community and surrounding area.

Equally important is the wide variety of recreational, cultural and youth organizations that make Redvers such an active community. Artemis Dance Club welcomes upwards of 200 dancers from across the region, with many families travelling an hour or more each week to participate.

Residents also enjoy opportunities through minor hockey, minor ball, archery, 4-H, golf, school sports including volleyball, basketball and badminton, and many other community-led activities. Our Redvers Golf Club is a regional destination that hosts tournaments, community events and social gatherings throughout the summer, contributing to both recreation and tourism.

Together, these businesses, organizations and volunteers create a welcoming, connected and prosperous community that continues to grow while offering exceptional opportunities for residents and visitors alike.



Water Treatment Plant – Investing in Our Future

One of the Town of Redvers' most significant accomplishments is the beginning of construction of our new Water Treatment Plant, a transformational project that will serve our community for generations to come. This project has been several years in the making.

Following a visit from the Water Security Agency in December 2021, the Town immediately began planning for the future of our water system. Over the past 4.5 years, extensive engineering studies, regulatory approvals, well decommissioning, development of a new municipal well, and countless hours of planning laid the foundation for this critical infrastructure project.

After approximately eight months of preparing the application, the Town was successful in securing \$4.5 million through the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP), funded jointly by the Government of Canada and the Province of Saskatchewan.

The project was tendered in December 2025, with CCR Construction Ltd. awarded the contract.



Although the project came in substantially higher than anticipated, approximately \$9.7 million compared to the original estimate of \$6.1 million, Council and Administration acted quickly to secure additional financing, amend utility rates and develop a sustainable financial plan to move the project forward. Despite these challenges, Council remained committed to ensuring Redvers has safe, reliable drinking water for decades to come.

Construction officially began in the spring of 2026 and has been exciting to watch as the new facility takes shape. Throughout construction, the Town has remained committed to transparency by providing residents with regular weekly project updates from BCL Engineering and CCR Construction through our website, Facebook page and video updates featuring Mayor Brad Bulbuck, CAO Tricia Pickard, and Foreman Dwight Jorgensen. These updates have helped residents understand the project's progress while providing a personal connection to the people leading this important investment.

Like many aging communities, Redvers has experienced challenges with older water infrastructure during this transition. As changes in water treatment have gradually removed decades of mineral buildup inside aging water mains and service lines, some hidden weaknesses in pipes more than 60 years old have become apparent. While this resulted in several repairs, the Town has worked diligently to address issues as they arose, always keeping residents informed along the way.

This project represents far more than a new treatment plant, it is an investment in the long-term sustainability, health and prosperity of our community. It demonstrates the perseverance, collaboration and forward-thinking approach of Council, Administration, staff, funding partners and contractors, ensuring future generations of Redvers residents continue to enjoy safe, reliable drinking water while supporting future growth and development.
