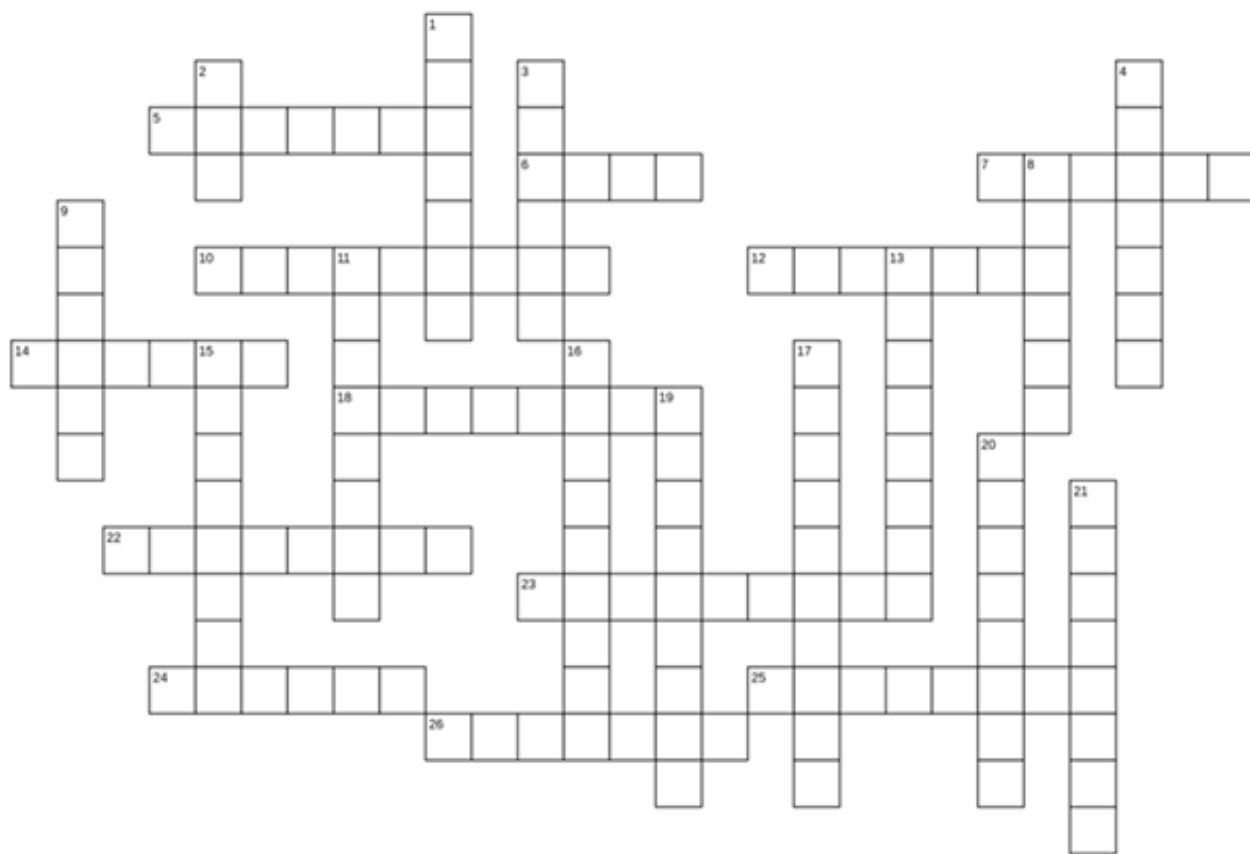
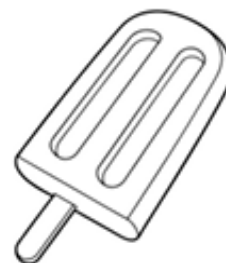

July already!! What happened to June? It sure didn't feel very June!

The good thing is that watering hasn't been a very stressful chore, but it makes it hard to get that fertilizing done when things are always wet. Anytime you are forced to water right now, it is a good idea to give those flowers some food fertilizer. We also haven't had very much heat, but when there is, the plants sure are trying to soak it in as much as possible.

Now that summer is here, kind of, and you have some holidays booked, what do you do to keep everything alive while you are away!? I have a few tricks to help.

If you have a neighbour watering and can easily move planters, try and gather them all together to make it easier for your helper. You can also put them in a little shadier area to make their moisture last a little longer.

Filling an empty glass bottle with water and putting it in the pot upside down will allow the plant to drink when thirsty. Or simply putting a large plate under the pot and filling with water can help them drink up when they are thirsty.

If your flowers are starting to get leggy before you go on your trip, cut them back before hand so that there are no blooms while you are away instead of you having to cut them back when you get back, fertilize at this time also.

The Town Office staff have been busy collecting and processing water meter readings. Considerable time has been dedicated to ensuring readings are accurate and accounts are up to date as we work toward finalizing and distributing upcoming utility notices.

We recently met with CCR Construction and BCL Engineering for our quarterly meeting regarding the Water Treatment Plant upgrade. The project timeline is exactly where we want it to be, which we are very happy about, especially as there have been a few delays due to weather.

In June, we also celebrated a few work anniversaries. Jaxon Henrion has been our Maintenance Operator for one year, and Yvan Toupin has been our casual Transit Bus Driver for a year as well. We are so lucky to have these guys on our team. Keep up the great work!

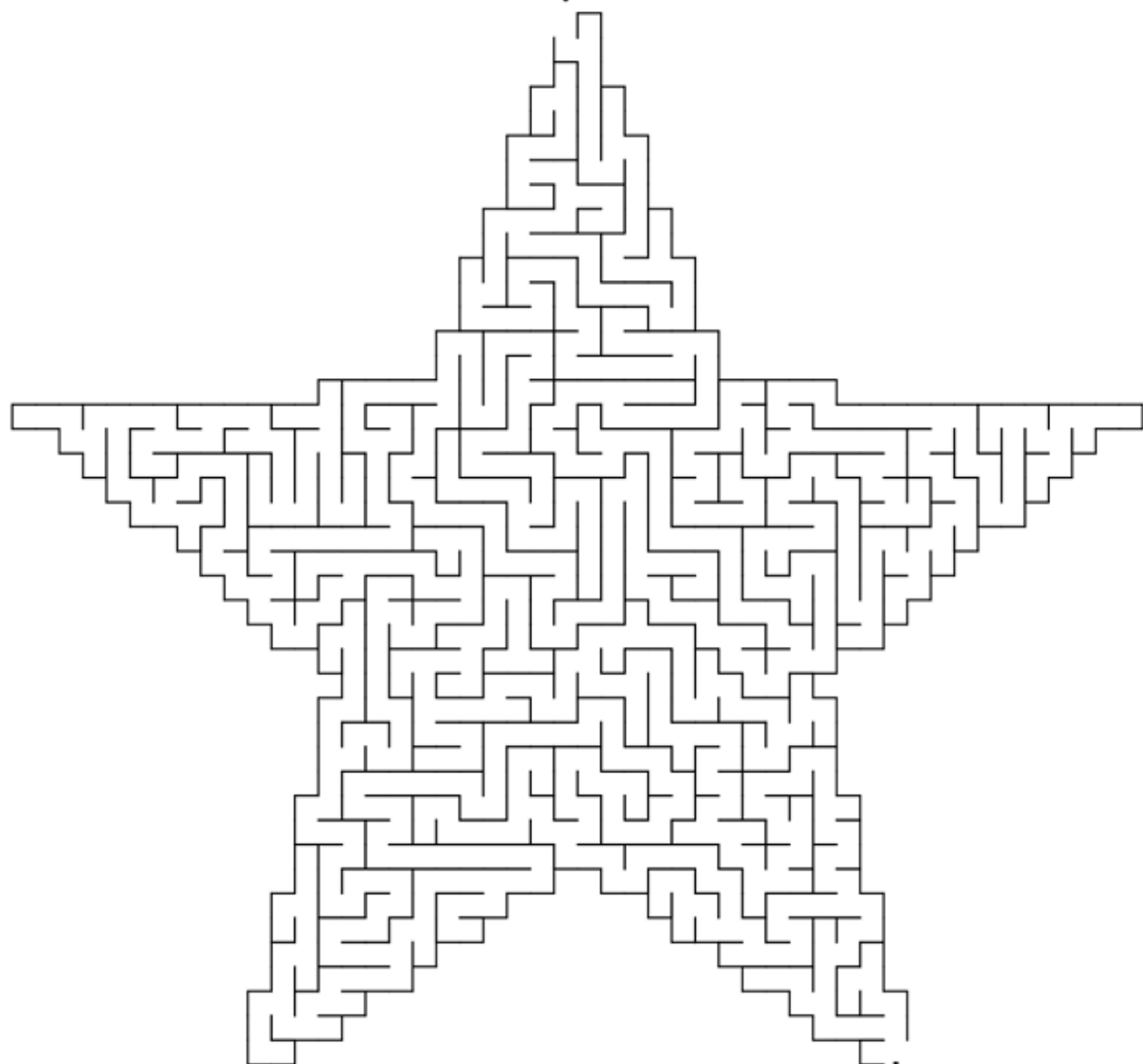

I use the term ‘seems like’ because I’m not sure. After all, what is ‘wonky’? What is ‘unwonky’? These are the Canadian Prairies, a vast expanse of space where weather can approach from any direction and provide a multitude of different outcomes. Anyone who chooses to live here has to be prepared for everything.

I remember the winter was dry. At least that's what I kept hearing as spring approached. There was a lot of moaning and groaning about there not being enough snow cover. That the dugouts wouldn't fill. That the pastures were going to be in trouble. Better check the water level in the well.

By the time I got home from my European river cruise in early April he had the sump pump set up in the basement and it's been pumping on a regular basis ever since. Pastures are lush and green. Dugouts are full to overflowing.

Or, am I only recalling it that way because every time I wanted to do something outside it was coolish and soggy. It's not like I document every detail. I did get my whole garden planted into perfect soil conditions for a change. And it has been hot enough for a day or two to have the portulaca population explode; that stuff only performs in significant heat.

And then there were those days of hurricane force winds with zero visibility in blowing dirt. Not necessarily unknown in Saskatchewan but certainly the worst I've ever experienced. My cabin air filter in my car is supposed to keep the reading at a green zero. If the numbers start to rise the colour goes to a warning yellow and during the worst of the forest fire smoke last year occasionally I would see 226 or thereabouts. I got caught out in a blackout (opposite of a snowstorm whiteout) in that dust storm and the number was a 478 in red. My car reminds me frequently that at my next oil change it needs a new air filter. Probably if I listened closely I could hear it wheezing.

We are now in July. All that excess water has my yard lush, green and sporting an alarming number of mosquito breeding pools. Even on a year that isn't 'wonky' I struggle to stay ahead of the grass mowing job. This year it's more than an unsuitable-weather-for-mowing problem, it's a mower-needs-attention problem. I guess after a dozen years it requires more than the oil change and tire check maintenance it has been getting. Apparently bolts vibrate loose, mower table clutches seize resulting in ripped wiring, and throttle cables rust solid. Because my husband is a pretty resourceful mechanic I have been limping along with interim fixes but there's a lot of grass out there and it's growing really fast. If the throttle cable gives up the ghost completely before it's replacement arrives we may as well invite someone to come bale hay.

Which brings us to the next worry on the farmer's list. Remember how in March there wasn't going to be any hay or pasture because it was so dry? For at least a week now the first sound I hear every morning is a groan about "*when is it ever going to be dry enough to cut hay?*"

I offered no comment in March and I keep quiet now too. Given the flooding crises situation north and east of here, we are sitting pretty.

Six more weeks and we will be into harvest. wonder how many more rounds of weather wonkiness we will cycle through by then.

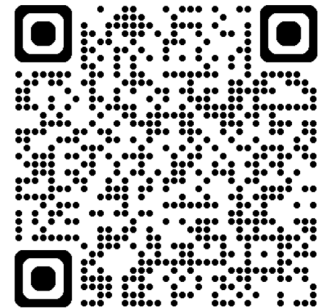

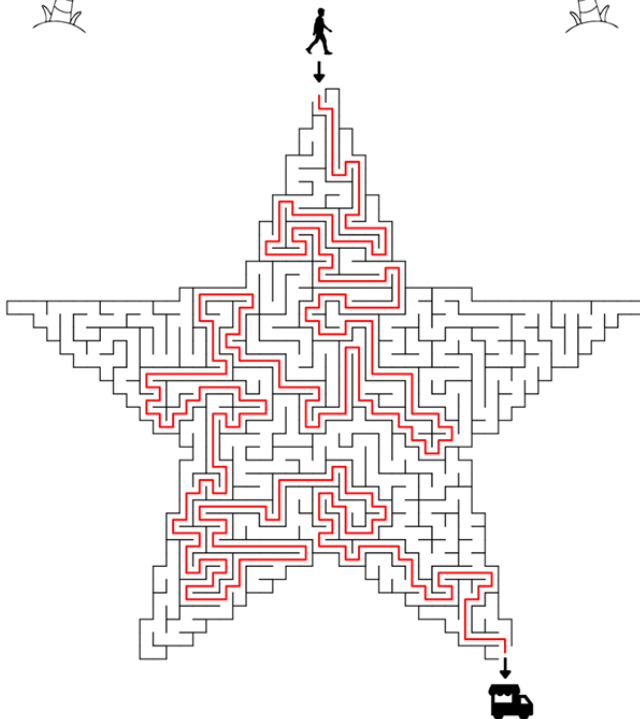

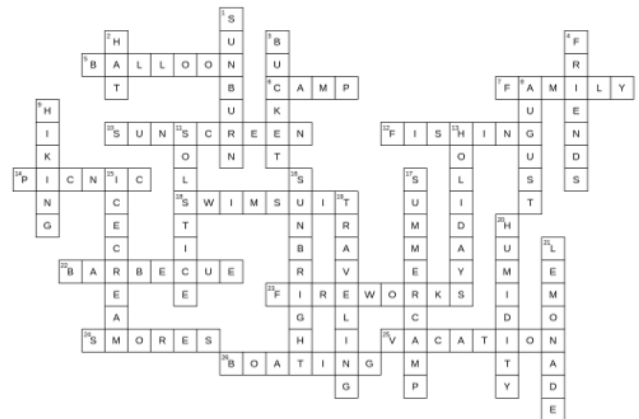
