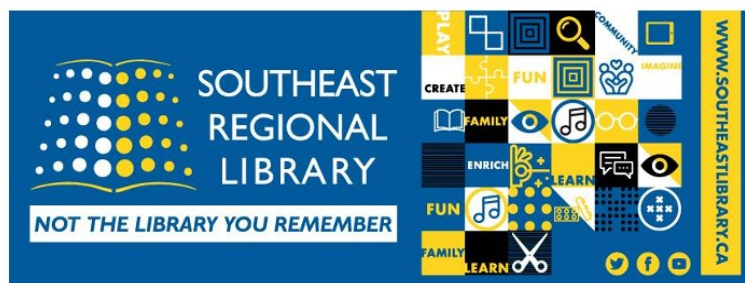

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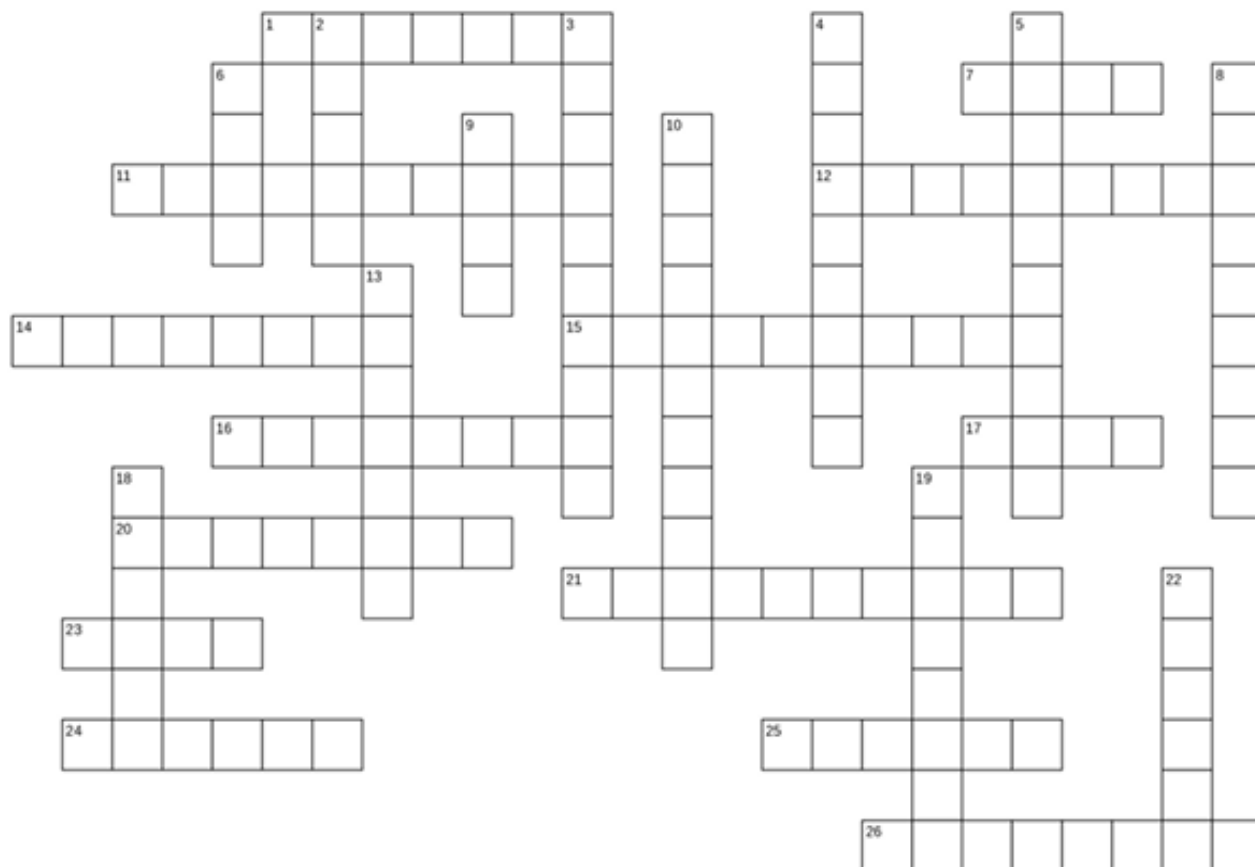

DOG DAYS OF SUMMER

I know from my Facebook memories of other years that we have hot stretches of weather every summer but I'm feeling old and crotchety right now so I'm going to play my 'old codger' card and say "*it's never been this bad before*".

This part is the truth though: I have never handled the heat well (my ancestors are from the cool and cloudy highlands of Scotland so I am genetically programmed for much less heat and cooler conditions). There is also the age factor: even if the temperatures aren't higher than they have been in the past, the fact that I am older makes it harder for me to deal with the heat. It just 'feels hotter' to me, and I am not talking about the humidex either, although having the humidity at 97% certainly does not help.

We don't have air conditioning in our house. For 95% of the year this is not a problem. For the other 5% it's something I regret, but not for long enough to do anything about it once the heat wains and life goes back to normal. What we do have is a huge expanse of ceramic tile through the main part of the house that acts as a natural cooler. When I chose ceramic tile over other flooring it was because of its durability factor. It's power to be an efficient conductor of heat and cold only came up in warnings from other people who told me that it would be cold to walk on in bare feet. This Scottish Highlander didn't register that as being a problem. Besides, I own socks.

What we did find was that if we opened all the windows for the night and closed them first thing in the morning the cool stored in those tiles kept the house a very reasonable temperature all day. The installation of the floor cost about the same as an air conditioning unit for this size of house but we only had to pay for it once and it uses zero electricity to run. The one negative aspect is that over a long stretch of time when the night temperature doesn't drop low enough to recharge the cool in the tile we reach a point where we are stuck living in a sauna.

That's where we are now ... living in a sauna.

It could be worse. We could be living in a two-story house. I grew up in one. If your bedroom is on the second floor that's a special kind of sauna hell.

The period between July 3 and August 11 is called the Dog Days of Summer, not because it has anything to do with dogs but because the ancient Romans blamed the extra summer heat on the dog star Sirius being at its zenith during that time and adding its heat to the sun's.

The real, scientific explanation does have to do with celestial movements though – because of Earth's seasonal wobble we get the most direct sunlight full on at the summer solstice in June but there is a thermal lag time while the extra heat affects the ocean's temperatures before we have to deal with it on land in the northern hemisphere.

There is also the folk wisdom humans have added: that fevers and bad luck and general madness can be blamed on the heat. I totally understand the madness reference; we Highlanders don't cope well at temperatures above 70 Fahrenheit (see how old I am?), 20 Celsius for all the young'uns out there, and at times the heats would drive me crazy if I had the energy to muster it.

And so we wait it out in the summer of 2026. The temperatures will eventually drop. My cool-stabilizing floor will reset. In no time people will start complaining about winter and this sauna hell will be forgotten history until July of 2027 when Facebook reminds me that it happens every year.

The month of July has been a busy one for the Town of Redvers, and we are pleased to share a few updates and reminders with residents.

The Town of Redvers is proud to continue our annual Headstone Cleaning Project for the 5th consecutive year. This important initiative helps preserve the beauty, history, and dignity of our cemetery while ensuring it remains a respectful place for families and visitors. Council budgets annually for the care and maintenance of the cemetery, and community support helps us continue this meaningful work.

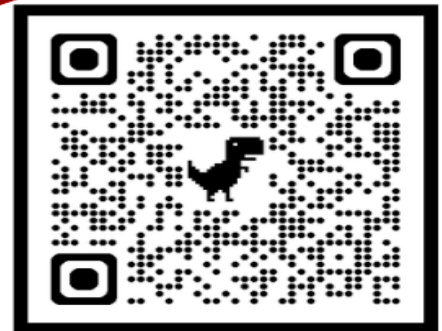

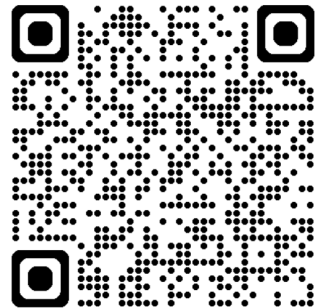
